LEADS/NCIC Records – Deceased Subject

In the event a subject of a LEADS/NCIC record has been reported deceased, the record should be cleared from the system upon verification. Generally, a death certificate or coroner's report will suffice as documentation when the entry is cleared.

If the subject of a wanted person or protection order entry is reported deceased your agency should notify the court that issued the warrant or order to determine what their requirements are to quash or recall the warrant or protection order.

If the subject of a Sex Offender Registry entry is reported deceased, your agency must contact the ISP SOR Unit to report the finding and have the record removed.
