### Safe Gun Storage Act (PA 104-0031) Lost/Stolen Gun Requirements

Pursuant to Public Act 104-0031, also known as the Safe Gun Storage Act, effective January 1, 2026, all law enforcement agencies must notify the Illinois State Police Firearms Services Bureau (FSB) at [ISP.FelonyReporting@Illinois.gov](mailto:ISP.FelonyReporting@Illinois.gov) whenever an individual fails to comply with the reporting requirements of the Act. Specifically, anyone whose firearm is lost or stolen must file a report with law enforcement within 48 hours once it occurs or when they learn it has occurred, and the report shall include:

- The date the firearm was lost or stolen
- The last known location of the firearm
- The caliber, make, model, and serial number
- A description of the circumstances under which the firearm was lost or stolen.

When submitting a failure to report incident to the ISP, please include in your email:

- Name of the firearm owner (first, middle, last)
- DOB
- Sex/Gender
- Race
- DLN or ID #
- SSN if available
- FOID #
- Current Address/County of Residence
- County in which firearm was reported lost or stolen
- If Charges are filed against the firearm owner, include
  - Filing County
  - Charge(s)
  - Misdemeanor or Felony (and Class if known)
  - Case # (if available).
- Copy of the Incident Report
