Orders of Protection with Zeroes in the Expiration Date (EXP) Field

When an order of protection is issued with an indefinite expiration date or an expiration date dependent on a future event (e.g., release from jail, issuance of final divorce decree, completion of probation term, etc.), the Expiration Date (EXP) field of the LEADS entry will be completed with zeroes. These orders of protection are enforceable, provided they have been served and the Served Date (SRV) is completed with a date of service.

Anytime there is a question about the validity of a record, a hit confirmation message should be sent to the Originating Authority (ORA). If an officer receiving a hit on his MDC is unsure how to interpret the record, assistance should be sought from another operator, such as a full access operator in dispatch.
