Automated Responses from the FBI on Wanted Entries/Modifications

Recently, agencies have been questioning automated responses from the FBI CJIS Division regarding wanted entries/modifications. You will recall that when a Wanted Person record containing the FBI/UCN number are forwarded to NCIC, the fingerprints associated with that FBI/UCN number within the Next Generation Identification (NGI) system is flagged with a possible "wanted notice."

On Wednesday February 24, 2021 an NGI System enhancement was implemented. Following CJIS Advisory Policy Board guidance, the FBI has created new automated messages to agencies with wanted persons records in NCIC that are flagged in the NGI System. These messages are sent when the following actions are taken on the records within NGI that have a **wanted notice** flag: disposition updates, modifications of names or dates of birth, expungement of last criminal event within the Universal Control Number, and supervised release updates.

Example response:

"Reference Disposition Request from (insert agency/ORI)".
To: "Police Department or Sheriffs Office"
"location", IL
NCIC CJIS Systems Officer - For Information
Caution: 00 - Armed and Dangerous
Investigative value. Wanted notice (NIC/XXXXXXXXXXXX) .
A disposition was updated to DOA (date will be here), UCN "UCN number".
Updated identity history record is available via the III.
