CHICAGO – TASC's (Treatment Alternatives for Safe Communities) Center for Health and Justice is kicking off the Chicagoland Youth Deflection Initiative on May 28, 2025 by bringing together organizations and leaders to learn more about the emerging <u>field of deflection</u>.
