## Conclusions:

The Vernon Hills Communications Center's consolidation plan meets the requirements for a consolidation plan as prescribed by Section 1324.200(c) of Illinois Admin. Code Part 1324.200 – Consolidation of 9-1-1 Emergency Systems.

Under 50 ILCS 15.4a(a)(6), any 9-1-1 Authority that does not have a PSAP within its jurisdiction shall be consolidated through an intergovernmental agreement with an existing 9-1-1 Authority that has a PSAP to create a Joint Emergency Telephone Board. Neither Libertyville nor Lincolnshire ETSBs have a PSAP within their respective jurisdiction. With this consolidation plan, this requirement has been fulfilled by both Libertyville and Lincolnshire dissolving their ETSBs and creating a joint ETSB with Vernon Hills, whose ETSB was also dissolved.
