Conclusions:

The Proviso-Leyden Joint 9-1-1 Authority's plan to consolidate with the Village of Rosemont is missing financial information regarding the recurring costs prior to consolidation, proposed recurring costs for the consolidated system and estimated nonrecurring cost for consolidation pursuant to Section 1324.200(c)(1)(E)(v) of Illinois Admin. Code Part 1324 – Consolidation of 9-1-1 Emergency Systems. The Department has requested that this information be provided to the Department before a Final Order is issued by the Administrator. The consolidation plan does not meet the requirements as prescribed in Section 1324.200(c) until the financial information is complete.

The Village of Rosemont serves a population of approximately 4,200 and is required to consolidate pursuant to 50 ILCS 15.4a(a)(2), which provides that in any county with a population of at least 250,000 that has more than one Emergency Telephone System Board, Joint Emergency Telephone System Board, or qualified governmental entity, any 9-1-1 Authority serving a population of less than 25,000 shall be consolidated such that no 9-1-1 Authority in the county serves a population of less than 25,000. This proposed consolidation with the Proviso-Leyden Joint 9-1-1 Authority will satisfy the requirement. The population served by Proviso-Leyden after consolidation will be approximately 81,400.
