Conclusions:

The West Central Consolidated Communications JETSB's consolidation plan generally meets the requirements for a consolidation plan as prescribed by Section 1324.200(c) of Illinois Admin. Code Part 1324.200 – Consolidation of 9-1-1 Emergency Systems.

Under 50 ILCS 15.4a(a)(2), in any county with a population of at least 250,000 that has more than one Emergency Telephone System Board, Joint Emergency Telephone System Board, or qualified governmental entity, any 9-1-1 Authority serving a population of less than 25,000 shall be consolidated such that no 9-1-1 Authority in the county serves a population of less than 25,000. Brookfield, North Riverside, Riverside and McCook each serve populations less than 25,000. As a result, all four ETSBs are required to consolidate. All four 9-1-1 authorities will dissolve their respective ETSBs and join the West Central Consolidated Communications JETSB.

The above consolidation requirements will be fulfilled by these 9-1-1 authorities dissolving their ETSBs and joining the West Central Consolidated Communications JETSB. The combined population served will be approximately 34,830.

The mutual backup agreement should be provided to the Statewide 9-1-1 Administrator before an order approving this consolidation is granted.
