An IGA between Cook County ETSB and CalComm for the transfer and reporting of 9-1-1 surcharge funds attributable to the Village of Robbins was included in the plan. Any funds held by Cook County attributable to the Village of Robbins will be transferred to CalComm including any surcharge funds collected after the Village of Robbins becomes a member of the CalComm JETSB. However, since the Village of Robbins did not previously have an ETSB there is no hold harmless amount attributable to the Village of Robbins. Therefore, the only surcharge that can be transferred by the State to the CalComm Joint ETSB will be based on a new wireless plan including a new zip code agreement for the Village of Robbins area will need to be filed by CalComm for approval once this modification is completed and receives an order. ## **Conclusions:**

This plan modification filed by CalComm requests to opt in the Village of Robbins from the Cook County 9-1-1 System. Cook County has also filed a plan modification requesting to opt out the Village of Robbins to the CalComm 9-1-1 System. Cook County's serving population is 196,386 and CalComm's serving population is 56,201, therefore both meet the requirement to serve the minimum population of at least 25,000 in their respective 9-1-1 system per Section 15.4a, 2) of the ETSA.

In order to further address the transfer of surcharge for the Village of Robbins per the IGA, the CalComm Joint ETSB will need to file a new wireless plan including the Village of Robbins. A new zip code agreement between Cook County and CalComm will need to be included in the wireless plan for the Village of Robbins territory.
