In addition, the first amendment was included in the plan whereby the City of Countryside will no longer be a part of the SWC911 System and will be joining the LTACC JETSB. All 9-1-1 calls for Countryside will be directed to LTACC. An IGA between LTACC and SWC911 for the transfer and reporting of 9-1-1 surcharge funds attributable to the City of Countryside was included in the plan. Any funds held by SWC911 attributable to Countryside will be transferred to the LTACC JETSB including any surcharge funds collected after Countryside becomes a member of the LTACC JETSB. Since Countryside did not previously have an ETSB, there is no hold harmless amount attributable to Countryside. Wireless surcharge is the only surcharge amount that will be transferred to LTACC going forward once a wireless plan is filed and approved.
