RECOMMENDED DECISION

I. BACKGROUND

On December 14, 2018, Saline/Gallatin County Regional Joint ETSB (the “Applicant”) filed a Consolidation Plan (“Consolidation Plan” or “Plan”) with the Office of the Statewide 9-1-1 Administrator pursuant to Section 15.4a of the Emergency Telephone System Act (“ETSA”). 50 ILCS 750/15.4a. The Applicant currently operates an Emergency Telephone System Board (“ETSB”). The Plan proposes the addition of Gallatin County to the ETSB to form a Joint Emergency Telephone System Board (JETSB). Upon consolidation according to the Consolidation Plan, the system will be changing its 911 System Provider from NG911, Inc. to INdigital, Inc. and will have redundant Legacy Network Gateways (LNG’s) and Emergency Service Routing Proxy’s (ESRP’s) otherwise referred to as selective routers that will handle all call routing for the Saline County Public Safety Answering Point (“PSAP”).

Under Section 15.4a(a)(6) of the Emergency Telephone System Act, 50 ILCS 750/15.4a(a)(6), any 9-1-1 Authority that does not have a PSAP within its jurisdiction shall be consolidated through an intergovernmental agreement with an existing 9-1-1 Authority that has a PSAP to create a Joint Emergency Telephone Board. Gallatin County does not have a PSAP but rather currently contracts with Saline County for 9-

1-1 call handling and dispatching. Under the consolidation plan, Saline County proposes to consolidate with Gallatin County and establish a Joint ETSB to be served by one PSAP located in Saline County. Neither county individually serves a population greater than 25,000¹. The regulations promulgated pursuant to the ETSA specify the procedures and requirements of such a consolidation plan, 83 Ill. Adm. Code 1324.200, *et. seq.* (the “Regulations”).

On January 3, 2019, Illinois State Police staff, Ms. Marci Elliott, issued a Department Review of Consolidation reporting on a technical review of the Consolidation Plan, as required by the Sections 1324.200(f)(1) and 1325.205 of the Regulations, 83 Ill. Adm. Code 1324.200(f)(1) and 83 Ill. Adm. Code 1325.205.

An administrative hearing was held before a duly authorized Administrative Law Judge, Michelle Thielen, on January 25, 2019. Lieutenant Tracy Felty, Saline and Gallatin County 911 Director, appeared in support of the Consolidation Plan. Debra Prather, Director of Regulatory Affairs for INdigital Telecom was present. Attorney Suzanne Bond appeared for the Illinois State Police. Attorney Bond called Ms. Marci Elliot as a witness. Ms. Elliott testified she prepared the Department Review of Consolidation and that no comments had been received by the Department regarding the Consolidation Plan. Neither the Illinois Commerce Commission or the public had concerns or objections to the Consolidation Plan. Ms. Elliott stated there were no requests to speak at the hearing. Ms. Elliott indicated the Department recommends approval of the Consolidation Plan without any alterations and without delay.

II. EVIDENCE

The evidence adduced at the Hearing is:

1. The Consolidation Application dated December 14, 2018 as amended herein by Applicant’s Exhibit “1”, Amended Financial Information;

2. The Department Review of Consolidation dated January 3, 2019, authored by Marci Elliott; and,
3. The presentation and explanation of the Consolidation Plan presented by Lt. Felty;

III. CONSOLIDATION PLAN

The Consolidation Plan and the testimony of the witness at the hearing established the following facts:

- A. Saline and Gallatin Counties each operated ETSBs.
- B. Saline has entered into an intergovernmental agreement (IGA) with Gallatin County to Consolidate into a joint 9-1-1 system. Both counties have passed ordinances dissolving their individual ETSBs.

IV. TECHNICAL REVIEW

The technical review performed by Ms. Elliott concludes that Applicant's consolidation plan meets the requirements for a consolidation plan as prescribed by Section 1324.200(c) and 1325.205 of the Consolidation of 9-1-1 Emergency Systems and Standards of Service Applicable to 9-1-1 Emergency Systems Regulations. Cost Projections, Network Costs, Back-up PSAP Agreement or Call-Handling and Aid Agreements have been supplied to the Statewide 9-1-1 Administrator. The Technical Review indicates that the proposed Saline/Gallatin County Joint ETSB complies with necessary requirements for approval of the Consolidation Plan.

V. FINDINGS OF FACT AND RECOMMENDATION

HAVING REVIEWED the entire record herein and being fully advised in the premises, it is:

A. FOUND that:

1. The Consolidation Plan furthers the statutory goal of ETSA to establish 9-1-1 as the primary emergency telephone number for use in the State of Illinois. ETSA further states the statutory goal that "it is in the public interest to shorten the time required for a citizen to request and receive emergency aid."

50 ILCS 750/1. This goal will be furthered with the approval of this Consolidation Plan.

2. The Consolidation Plan meets the requirements for a consolidation plan as required by Section 200(c) of Part 1324 of the Regulations.
3. In particular, the Consolidation Plan includes a completed application consisting of the following documents:
 - a. Contact and 9-1-1 system information;
 - b. Sworn statement of attesting to the truth of the information provided in the Plan;
 - c. Letter that is sent to the 9-1-1 system provider with a copy of the Plan; and
 - d. Summary of the proposed system's operation, including information as to how the plan will assist with achieving the statutory goals enumerated in ETSA Section 5.4b(a). 83 Ill. Adm. Code 1324.200(c)(1).
4. In addition, the Consolidation Plan provides the following in compliance with Section 200(c)(1)(F) -(I) of Part 1324 of the Regulations:
 - a. List of all communities that are served by the 9-1-1 system;
 - b. List of public safety agencies that are dispatched by the 9-1-1 system;
 - c. List of the public safety agencies that are adjacent to the 9-1-1 system's geographic boundaries; and
 - d. List of the carriers and interconnection VoIP providers that are known by the Applicant to provide service within the jurisdiction of the 9-1-1 system.
5. The Applicant has attached to the Consolidation Plan the following documents as required by Section 200(c)(1)(J) of Part 1324:
 - a. A local ordinance that dissolves an existing ETSB;
 - b. An intergovernmental agreement creating a Joint ETSB or any other agreements pertinent to the 9-1-1 system consolidation;
 - d. The network diagram that is provided by the 9-1-1 system provider; and

- e. The Call Handling and Aid Outside Jurisdictional Boundaries Agreements, 83 Ill. Adm. Code 1324.200(c)(1)(J).
6. The Consolidation Plan incorporates a next generation (NG9-1-1) solution, which meets the requirements set forth in Section 1325.205 of the Regulations.

B. DETERMINED that:

1. The Saline/Gallatin County Joint ETSB has filed a 9-1-1 Consolidation Plan pursuant to 50 ILCS 750/15.4a of the Emergency Telephone System Act;
2. The Saline/Gallatin County Joint ETSB Consolidation Plan furthers the statutory goals of the Emergency Telephone System Act;
3. The Saline/Gallatin County Joint ETSB Consolidation Plan meets the requirements of 83 Ill. Adm. Code 1324.200(c) and 83 Ill. Adm. Code 1325.205; and
4. The Saline/Gallatin County Joint ETSB Consolidation Plan should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE RECOMMENDED that the Saline/Gallatin County Joint ETSB Consolidation Plan be approved, subject to the condition identified above.
