

Plan Narrative: Indian Head Park will consolidate with the Cook County ETSB on February 28th 2019. AT&T has determined through a network study that Cook County has sufficient capacity to support this call load.

FIVE YEAR STRATEGIC PLAN FOR MODIFIED PLAN

Narrative:

In anticipation of future consolidations, the Cook County Emergency Telephone System Board and the Cook County Sheriff's Office began expanding its' 9-1-1 Center in July 2015. Currently the main center in Des Plaines has 32 positions. These include 19 full dispatch positions, 4 call taking positions and 9 positions that are built and waiting for computer equipment.

The Maywood back up center, which was renovated in 2017, has 10 dispatch positions. There are 9 positions that are built and waiting for computer equipment.

The design of the Cook County next generation capable phone system from Zetron is unique in that it provides redundancy with a full independent system at the primary site and the back up site. The system allows operators to select which controller they are using which essentially allows the back up center to work simultaneously with the primary site. This increases the active call taking positions to 33 operator positions with room for 18 additional through added equipment.

In 2017, through a partnership with the Illinois Department of Transportation, Cook County expanded its' Motorola P1 CAD system to have an additional capacity of one million calls for service per year. This expansion includes a refresh of all server software and virtualizes the current environment. Infrastructure upgrades in the past 5 years include upgraded server room HVAC, next generation phone system, power redundancy and a new UPS. This has prepared the Cook County 9-1-1 Center to accept new consolidations over th next few years without passing on the cost of technology or infrastructure to its' contract agencies.

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INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF COOK ON BEHALF OF THE COOK COUNTY SHERIFF AND INDIAN HEAD PARK

This Intergovernmental Agreement ("IGA") is entered into by and between the County of Cook ("County") on behalf of the Sheriff of Cook County ("Sheriff") and Indian Head Park ("Village"), (collectively, the "Parties"), pursuant to authority granted by the Illinois Constitution of 1970, Article VII, Section 10, and The Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq.

I. RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Cook County Emergency Telephone Systems Board ("Cook ETSB") operates the Cook County 9-1-1 system ("9-1-1 System") in the unincorporated areas of Cook County and certain municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff processes 9-1-1 calls and provides other services for the 9-1-1 System, including call taking, dispatching, and radio monitoring; and

WHEREAS, the budget for the Sherift's Office, through the Annual Appropriation Bill adopted by the County Board, currently funds the salary and benefits for in excess of sixty employees who currently staff the 9-1-1 System's communication center; and

WHEREAS, the Village Police have conducted their dispatch activity on the Village Emergency Telephone Systems Board, but are required to consolidate dispatch services with another emergency telephone systems board; and

WHEREAS, Village desires to obtain the Sheriff's 9-1-1 System dispatching services for Village Police and agrees to reimburse the Sheriff for providing said services pursuant to this IGA: and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff agrees to provide 9-1-1 System dispatching/monitoring services to Village Police twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week:

WHEREAS, the County, the Sheriff and Village seek to enter into this IGA where the Sheriff will provide dispatch services to the Village Police;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements set forth herein, the Parties agree as follows:

II. INCORPORATION OF RECITALS

The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein as though fully set forth.

III. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- A. Term: The term of this IGA shall begin upon approval by the Statewide Administrator ("Effective Date") and shall continue for five (5) years from the Effective Date ("Termination Date"). Provided however, that this IGA shall not commence until the actual date of withdrawal of the Village from Southwest Central Dispatch and Southwest Central 911 System.
- **B.** Termination: Either the Sheriff or Village, may terminate this IGA at any time after the first three (3) months of the Term upon one hundred eighty (180) days written notice.

C. Roles and Responsibilities:

- The Sheriff agrees to provide 9-1-1 System dispatching services to Village twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. Village Police Department dispatch will be done on a Cook County 800 mhz frequency.
- 2) Village will adhere to current 9-1-1 Center procedures covering radio use and officer safety practices mandated by the Sheriff's Office.
- 3) It is understood that current Motorola XTS5000 radios will have reached their end of life service contract on December 31st 2018. Village will only be allowed to have TDMA capable radios on the Sheriff's radio system as of December 31st 2019.

D. Operational Reimbursement

1) Village agrees to reimburse the Sheriff's Office on a monthly basis, with the first invoice being sent prior to commencement of services, for all personnel and operational costs associated with this IGA, including but not limited to costs associated with any additional positions necessary for performance of services ("Sheriff's Reimbursement"). Reimbursements shall take place in accordance with the following schedule, with any partial year prorated based the number of days the IGA has been in effect for that year:

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1<sup>st</sup> year of service - $45,556.00
2<sup>nd</sup> year of service - $47,187.00
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^{3&}lt;sup>rd</sup> year of service - \$48.953.00

⁴th year of service - \$50,781.00

⁵th year of service - \$52,814.00

⁹¹¹ Surcharge amounts that are paid to the Sheriff or County on behalf of the Village shall reduce these amounts on a dollar for dollar basis.

2) Sheriff will send Village a monthly invoice. Payment to Sheriff will be due within thirty (30) days of receipt of invoice.

IV. INDEMNIFICATION

- A. Village agrees to indemnify, defend, save and hold the County and the Sheriff, and their respective Commissioners, agents, officers, and employees harmless from and against any and all liabilities, claims, demands or suits brought by any employee of Village pursuant to this IGA or member of the public arising out of any negligent act or omission of Village and/or its agents, officers, or employees in the performance of this IGA. Nothing herein shall waive any immunities the Village may assert in response or defense of any such claims.
- B. The CCSO assumes responsibility for the actions, conduct, and omissions of its employees, agents and officers.

V. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

In the event of a dispute between Village and the Sheriff concerning this IGA, each shall designate a representative who shall meet to resolve the dispute. If the designated representatives fail to resolve the dispute, then the Sheriff's General Counsel and Village's General Counsel are responsible for promptly resolving the dispute in good faith and in a cooperative manner. In the event the parties are not able to resolve any dispute, each party retains all rights and remedies at law or in equity.

VI. NOTICE

Unless otherwise specified, any notice, demand or request required hereunder shall be given in writing at the addresses set forth below, by any of the following means: (a) personal service during regular business hours; (b) facsimile transmission during regular business hours; (c) overnight courier; or (d) first class mail properly addressed with postage prepaid and deposited in the U. S. Mail. Any notice, demand or request served personally or by facsimile transmission as aforesaid shall be effective upon receipt. Any notice, demand or request served by overnight courier shall be deemed received on the business day immediately following deposit with the overnight courier. Any notice, demand or request served by U.S. mail shall be deemed received two (2) business days following deposit in the mail. Notices shall be served at the following addresses or at such other place as the Parties may from time to time designate in writing by notice given hereunder

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VII. MISCELLANEOUS

- A. Compliance with Laws. The Parties shall at all times observe and comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, statutes, ordinances, rules, regulations, codes and executive orders, now existing or hereinafter in effect, which may in any manner affect the performance of this IGA.
- B. <u>Counterparts</u> This IGA may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which, taken together, shall constitute a single, integrated instrument.
- C. Governing Law and Venue. This IGA shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois, without regard to the principles of conflicts of law thereof. If there is a lawsuit under this IGA, each Party hereto agrees to the original jurisdiction of those courts located within the County of Cook, State of Illinois, with regard to any controversy arising out of, relating to, or in any way concerning the execution or performance of this IGA.
- D. Entire Agreement; Modification. This IGA constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes any prior agreements, negotiations and discussions. This IGA may not be modified or amended in any manner without the prior written consent of the Parties hereto. No term of this IGA may be waived or discharged orally or by any course of dealing, but only by an instrument in writing signed by the Party benefited by such term.
- E. <u>Severability</u>. If any term of this IGA or any application thereof is held invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this IGA shall be construed as if such invalid part were never included herein and this Agreement shall be and remain valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- F. Conflicts. This IGA shall not be legally binding if entered into in violation of the provisions of the Public Officer Prohibited Activities Act, 50 ILCS 105/0.01 et seq.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to a request by the Village of Indian Head Park, the ETSB hereby approves the inclusion of the Village of Indian Head Park within the Cook County 9-1-1 System to commence upon the approval of the Statewide 911 Administrator of the Illinois State Police. Upon such approval, all telecommunications carriers shall be notified to impose the applicable surcharge rate for such 9-1-1 services as established by the State of Illinois upon all customers located within the village of Indian Head Park.



TEST PLAN DESCRIPTION


1) Description of test plan (back-up, overflow, failure, database).

The CCETSB has enough capacity to add the Village of Indian Head Park to its existing system with the need additional lines. The main Cook County dispatch site is located at 9511 W. Harrison in Des Plaines. In the event of a phone line failure, the 9-1-1 lines can either be manually switched over in Des Plaines by staff or switched by the 9-1-1 Resolution Center to Northwest Central and/or Southwest Central Dispatch system by selective router. The Cook County ETSB has a back up center located in the Sheriff's Police headquarters located at 1401 S. Maybrook Drive in Maywood, Illinois. This located is test on a monthly basis by 9-1-1 center staff and is coordinated with the 9-1-1 resolution center. Northwest Central Dispatch and Southwest Central Dispatch can handle overflow calls in the event a trunk line is busy at the CCETSB. The current phone system, which is Zetron Max Call Taking, connected from Des Plaines to Maywood through an Opt-E-Man circuit and has a backup of point to point microwave connection. The connection is monitored by the smart switches which can automatically fail over in the event of a disruption. Support for this infrastructure is provided by the Cook County Network Control Center (NCC). In the event that both paths were disrupted the Zetron controllers can function independently in both locations. The connection between Maywood and Des Plaines is not needed in order to have redundancy.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COOK COUNTY EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM BOARD AND

THE VILLAGE OF INDIAN HEAD PARK (Distribution of 911 Surcharge Funds)

This Intergovernmental Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into by and between the Cook County Emergency Telephone System Board ("ETSB") and the Village of Indian Head Park ("Village") (individually a "Party" and collectively the "Parties").

I. RECITALS

WHEREAS, the ETSB operates the Cook County 9-1-1 system ("County 9-1-1 System") in unincorporated areas of Cook County and certain municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted the Emergency Telephone System Act, 50 ILCS 750/0.01, et seq. ("Act") which enables a county to impose a surcharge on billed subscribers of network connections provided by telecommunications carriers at a rate per network connection in order to implement and maintain a 911 Emergency Telephone System ("Surcharge Funds"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 50 ILCS 15.4(a)(2), the Village has requested that it be included in the County 9-1-1 System and the ETSB has agreed to accept the Village into the County 9-1-1 System; and

WHEREAS, the consolidation of the Village's Emergency Telephone System Board with the Cook County ETSB has been approved by the Illinois State Police and is effective as of March 4, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the ETSB receives the Surcharge Funds allocated for each member of the ETSB from the Illinois State Police and the Village has agreed to use a specified percentage of those Surcharge Funds to reimburse the ETSB for the use of the County 9-1-1 System including 9-1-1 Center operations and technology; and

WHEREAS, the Village and ETSB have agreed that fifty percent (50%) of the Village's Surcharge Funds shall be forwarded by the ETSB to the Cook County Sheriff's Office for the payment of a portion of the Village's dispatch costs payable to the Sheriff's Office.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements set forth herein, the Parties agree as follows:

II. INCORPORATION OF RECITALS

The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein as though fully set forth herein.

III. TERM

The term of this Agreement shall commence as of the date of consolidation approval by the Statewide 9-1-1 Administrator ("Effective Date") and shall continue as long as Village is a member of the ETSB ("Term"); provided however, that this Agreement shall not commence until the actual date the Village withdraws from Southwest Central Dispatch and Southwest Central 911 System.

IV. TERMINATION

During the Term, either Party may terminate this Agreement upon ninety (90) days written notice to the other Party.

V. DISTRIBUTION OF VILLAGE SURCHARGE FUNDS

The Parties agree that 50% of the Village's Surcharge Funds shall be paid by the ETSB, on behalf of the Village, to the Cook County Sheriff's Office ("Sheriff") to reimburse the Sheriff for dispatch services pursuant to an Intergovernmental Agreement between the Village and the Sheriff dated July 25, 2018 and the remaining 50% of the City's Surcharge Funds will constitute reimbursement to the ETSB for the support of the 9-1-1 Center's operations and technology ("ETSB Reimbursement"). The ETSB shall make such reimbursement payments quarterly based on the ETSB's fiscal year with any partial year prorated based on the number of days this Agreement has been in effect for that year. The Parties agree that in the event the Illinois State Police or the State of Illinois fail to distribute the Surcharge Funds to the ETSB, for any reason whatsoever, then the ETSB shall withhold reimbursement of the Village's Surcharge Funds to both the Sheriff and ETSB until such time as the Surcharge Funds are distributed to the ETSB by the Illinois State Police or the State of Illinois.

VI. INDEMNIFICATION

- A. The Village agrees to indemnify, defend, save and hold the ETSB and its agents, officers, and employees harmless from and against any and all liabilities, claims, demands or suits brought by any employee of Village pursuant to this Agreement or by any member of the public arising out of any negligent act or omission of Village and/or its agents, officers, or employees in the performance of this Agreement. Nothing herein shall waive any immunities the Village may assert or defense of any such claims.
- B. The ETSB shall be responsible for the acts of its agents, officers, or employees in the performance of this Agreement.

VII. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

In the event of a dispute between the Village and the ETSB concerning this Agreement, each shall designate a representative who shall meet to resolve the dispute. If the designated representatives fail to resolve the dispute, then the Village's General Counsel and the ETSB's Attorney are responsible for promptly resolving the dispute in good faith and in a cooperative manner. In the event the parties are not able to resolve any dispute, each party retains all rights and remedies at law or in equity.

VIII. NOTICE

Unless otherwise specified, any notice, demand or request required hereunder shall be given in writing at the addresses set forth below, by any of the following means: (a) personal service during regular business hours; (b) facsimile transmission during regular business hours; (c) overnight courier; or (d) first class mail properly addressed with postage prepaid and deposited in the U. S. Mail. Any notice, demand or request served personally or by facsimile transmission as aforesaid shall be effective upon receipt. Any notice, demand or request served by overnight courier shall be deemed received on the business day immediately following deposit with the overnight courier. Any notice, demand or request served by U.S. mail shall be deemed received two (2) business days following deposit in the mail. Notices shall be served at the following addresses or at such other place as the Parties may from time to time designate in writing by notice given hereunder.

IX. GENERAL

- A. <u>Compliance with Laws</u>. The Parties shall at all times observe and comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, statutes, ordinances, rules, regulations, codes and executive orders, now existing or hereinafter in effect, which may in any manner affect the performance of this Agreement.
- B. <u>Counterparts</u> This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which, taken together, shall constitute a single, integrated instrument.
- C. Governing Law and Venue. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois, without regard to the principles of conflicts of law thereof. If there is a lawsuit under this Agreement, each Party hereto agrees to the original jurisdiction of those courts located within the County of Cook, State of Illinois, with regard to any controversy arising out of, relating to, or in any way concerning the execution or performance of this Agreement.
- D. <u>Entire Agreement; Modification</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes any prior Agreements, negotiations and discussions. This Agreement may not be modified or amended in any manner without the prior written consent of the Parties hereto. No term

- of this Agreement may be waived or discharged orally or by any course of dealing, but only by an instrument in writing signed by the Party benefited by such term.
- E. Severability. If any term of this Agreement or any application thereof is held invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement shall be construed as if such invalid part were never included herein and this Agreement shall be and remain valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- F. <u>Conflicts</u>. This Agreement shall not be legally binding if entered into in violation of the provisions of the Public Officer Prohibited Activities Act, 50 ILCS 105/0.01 et seq.

AGREEMENT RELATING TO TRANSFER AND REPORTING OF SURCHARGE FUNDS ATTRIBUTABLE TO THE VILLAGE OF INDIAN HEAD PARK, ILLINOIS

THIS AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is made and entered into the 13th day of March, 2019 (the "Effective Dare") by and between the Cook County Emergency Telephone System Board ("Cook County ETSB") and the Southwest Central 9-1-1 Emergency System Board ("SWC911") for the purpose of providing for the transfer of and reporting relating to certain surcharge funds attributable to the Village of Indian Head Park, Illinois, (sometimes referred herein individually a "Party" and collectively the "Parties").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Section 15.4a of the Emergency Telephone System Act, 50 ILCS 750/1 et seq.(the "Act"), requires any 9-1-1 Authority, as defined by the Act, in a county with a population of at least 250,000 to consolidate such that no 9-1-1 Authority in the county serves a population of less than 25,000; and

WHEREAS, Cook County ETSB operates the Cook County 9-1-1 system in unincorporated areas of Cook County and certain municipalities; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Act, SWC911 is a Joint ETSB, and the Village of Indian Head Park, along with the other municipalities, participates as a member municipality; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 50 ILCS 15.4(a)(2), the Village of Indian Head Park ("Village") requested that it be included in the County 9-1-1 System and the Cook County ETSB has agreed to accept the Village into the County 9-1-1 System; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the bylaws adopted by SWC911, the Village has provided notice of its termination as a member of SWC911 and its intention to join Cook County ETSB; and

WHEREAS, to facilitate the Village's transition from SWC911 to Cook County ETSB, the Parties desire to enter into this Agreement to confirm their understanding that the Village will cease to be a member of SWC911 and will become a member of Cook County ETSB; that, thereafter the boundaries for wireless emergency calls of each Party will change such that wireless emergency calls originating in the Village will be handled by Cook County ETSB; and, to provide for the transfer to Cook County ETSB of any funds held by SWC911 attributable to Village, after the effective date of the Village becoming a member of Cook County ETSB, including any surcharge funds (such as those funds commonly known as wireline and hold harmless surcharge funds) collected after the effective date of the Village becoming a member of Cook County ETSB, pursuant to the Act or any other applicable statue or ordinance ("the Funds").

NOW, THERFORE, in consideration of the promises and mutual covenants hereafter set forth, the Parties agree as follows:

Section 1. Incorporation of Recitals.

The foregoing preambles are hereby incorporated into this Agreement as if fully restated in this Section 1.

Section 2. Village Opt-Out.

Village has provided the notice required by SWC911's bylaws to terminate as a SWC911 member municipality and that upon approval of Cook County ETSB's consolidation plan by the State of Illinois' Office of the Statewide 9-1-1 Administrator; the Village shall become a member of Cook County ETSB.

Section 3. Wireless Call Boundaries.

Upon the Village becoming a Cook County ETSB member municipality, the wireless call boundaries of Cook County ETSB and SWCD911 shall change such that all wireless 9-1-1 calls originating in the Village shall no longer be dispatched by SWC911 and instead shall be dispatched by Cook County ETSB.

Section 4. Funds.

Once the consolidation plan is approved by the State of Illinois' Office of the Statewide 9-1-1 Administrator, Cook County ETSB shall receive all Funds attributable to the Village after the effective date of the Village becoming a member of Cook County ETSB in accordance with the Act. Cook County ETSB will be responsible for all Funds it receives and for the reporting and auditing of all Funds as described in Section 5 below.

Section 5. Financial Reporting of Funds.

SWC911 shall be responsible for all required financial reporting relating to the Funds, including the financial report required by Section 40 of the Act, up to and including the date that the Cook County ETSB's consolidation plan is approved by the State of Illinois' Office of the Statewide 9-1-1 Administrator. Thereafter, Cook County ETSB shall be responsible for all such reporting.

Section 6. Term.

The term of this Agreement shall commence on the Effective Date and shall end the later of (1) the date which is one (1) year after the date of approval of Cook County ETSB's consolidation plan by the State of Illinois' Office of the Statewide 9-1-1 Administrator or (2) the date upon which SWC911 files the last financial report relating to funds attributable to the Village as required by Section 5 hereof.

Section 7. Counterparts.

This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original and both of which shall constitute on and the same Agreement.

Section 8. Severability.

If any part of this Agreement shall be held invalid for any reason, the remainder of this Agreement shall remain valid to the maximum extent possible.

Section 9. Governing Law.

This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Illinois without giving consideration to the principals of conflict of laws.

Section 10. Entire Agreement.

This Agreement represents the entire agreement between the Parties and there are no other promises or conditions in any other agreement whether oral or written.
