#### Plan Narrative:

The purpose of this modification is to relocate the physical facility of the PSAP from the City of Palos Heights to the City of Palos Hills. The current implemented SWC911 's ISP/ICC approved plans for wireline and wireless inclusive of 9-1-1 text have been in place for years and will not change. The operations of SWCD will continue in its current operation without change. The methods and means of providing/continuing call dispatch services will continue to function in conformity with legislative requirements and ISP rules.

Within the new facility will be 13 new dispatch consoles equipped with the latest Moducom CPE capable of receiving ANI/ALI with the x, y and z coordinates and approved State GIS data for mapping utilized through the new Central Square CAD. Provisions for multiple fiber telephone service sources have been built into the site for possible future use. All voice and radio communications will be recorded both at the console positions for instant playback and in an Equature logging recorder providing for both instant playback and historical review. The backup power system consists of a 250 KW gas powered generator, redundancy with provisions for a roll up generator and a battery UPS system capable of sustaining the power requirements for critical operations for 1.5 hours in the event of a generator failure. The center generally is not open to the public. External access for any person is restricted by security doors and internal locking devices in conjunction with HD security camera system for external and internal monitoring and recording. Access to the data system is restricted to authorized employees utilizing multiple firewalls requiring multiple levels of security clearances for access by anyone.

The certified 9-1-1 system provider will remain AT&T, currently providing routing through Lombard, Blue Island and Elk Grove AT&T switches. All calls are received with all database information as currently available. The call routing will continue uninterrupted through these switches. SWCD will work with AT&T to insure that routing through the existing switches to the new facility is received as required.

#### SOUTHWEST CENTRAL 9-1-1 SYSTEM

#### INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into on the effective date specified hereafter, by and between the units of local government signatory hereto (hereinafter "members") and also those which may hereafter become signatory;

#### WITNESSETH:

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WHEREAS, the members have determined that the implementation of a 9-1-1 Emergency Telephone System would provide a significant public safety enhancement to the citizens of each of the participating municipalities and conform with the purpose of the Illinois Emergency Telephone System Act, <u>Ill. Rev. Stat.</u>, Chap. 134, Section 31; and

WHEREAS, the members have determined that a Joint 9-1-1 Emergency Telephone System would be beneficial to all the citizens of the members to this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 134, Section 44 of the <u>Illinois Revised Statutes</u> permits the formation of a Joint 9-1-1 Emergency Telephone System to implement and operate a 9-1-1 emergency telephone system; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 127, Section 743 of the <u>Illinois Revised Statutes</u> provides for the joint exercise by two or more units of local government of any power, privilege or authority which each may exercise individually; and

WHEREAS, Southwest Central Dispatch (hereinafter "SWCD"), an intergovernmental association which provides a combined public safety telecommunications system to its members has agreed to enter into a contract with the System Board of the Southwest Central 9-1-1 System to provide a Joint 9-1-1 Emergency Telephone System;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE MEMBERS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. <u>Venture Established</u>. Pursuant to the authorization of Chapter 127, Section 743 and Chapter 134, Section 30.01 et seq. of the <u>Illinois Revised Statutes</u>, the members hereby federate together in a cooperative venture for the joint and mutual operation of a 9-1-1 emergency telephone system, to be known as Southwest Central 9-1-1 System consisting of all members and any other units of local government which may hereafter become signatory to this Agreement.
- 2. <u>Joint Emergency Telephone System Board</u>. There is hereby established a Joint Emergency Telephone System Board which shall consist of one representative from each of the members and SWCD. Each subsequent participating unit of local

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government in the Southwest Central 9-1-1 System shall be entitled to one representative on the Joint Emergency Telephone System Board. Designation of the new participating unit of local government's board representative shall be specified by the participant's enabling ordinance.

- 3. <u>By-Laws</u>. Southwest Central 9-1-1 System shall be subject to and shall be governed by certain By-Laws which shall be adopted by the Joint Emergency Telephone System Board together with any amendments which may be made in the manner and means provided by the By-Laws.
- 4. <u>Participation</u>. Each member of the Southwest Central 9-1-1 System, and each unit of local government which may hereafter become a participant, is a member and is entitled to the rights and privileges and is subject to the obligations of membership, all as may be provided in the By-Laws.
- 5. <u>Termination</u>. Any member of the Southwest Central 9-1-1 System may cease to be a member hereto and may withdraw from participation in the manner and means set forth in the By-Laws.
- 6. <u>Powers of the Board</u>. The powers and duties of the Emergency Telephone System Board created by this Agreement shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
  - Planning a 9-1-1 Emergency Telephone System (hereinafter the "9-1-1 System");
  - Coordinating and supervising the implementation, upgrading, maintenance, repair and operation of the 9-1-1 System including the establishment of equipment specifications and coding systems;
  - 3. Receiving monies from the surcharge imposed under Section 45.3 of the Emergency Telephone System Act (<u>Ill.Rev.Stat., Chap. 134, Section 45.3</u>) and from any other sources, for deposit into the Emergency Telephone System Fund;
  - 4. Authorizing all disbursements from the Fund by Resolutions approved by a majority of all System Board members;
  - 5. Hiring, on a temporary or permanent basis, any staff necessary for the implementation, operation or upgrade of the 9-1-1 System;
  - 6. Making and entering into contracts;
  - 7. Acquiring, holding and disposing of property;

- Incurring debts, liabilities or obligations in accord with applicable law as necessary for the accomplishment of the purposes of the 9-1-1 System;
- 9. Purchasing and leasing necessary equipment; and
- 10. Exercising all powers necessary and incidental to carrying out the purposes set forth in Article I of the By-Laws, including but not limited to, hiring auditors and attorneys, approving amendments to these By-Laws, accepting new members, approving the annual budget of the 9-1-1 System, and determining the general policy of the 9-1-1 System, provided however, that such policy shall never be inconsistent with the laws of State of Illinois.
- 7. <u>Amendment</u>. This Agreement may not be amended, except by written agreement and resolution of all the then current members of the Southwest Central 9-1-1 System.
- 8. <u>Duration</u>. This Agreement shall continue in effect until rescinded by unanimous consent of the current parties or until terminated in the manner provided in the By-Laws.
- 9. <u>Enforcement</u>. Each member shall have the right to enforce this Agreement against any other member. Any member who shall fail or refuse to perform any or all of the member's obligations under this Agreement (hereinafter "member in default") shall be obligated to pay the costs, including reasonable attorney fees and court costs of the member or members who seek to enforce a member in default's performance or the member in default's obligations under this Agreement.
- 10. <u>Authorization</u>. Prior to execution of this Agreement, each member shall deliver to the other and to the Director of Southwest Central Dispatch a certified copy of a suitable ordinance authorizing and directing execution of this Agreement.
- 11. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Agreement shall become effective when signed by all authorized representatives of the City of Blue Island, the Village of Chicago Ridge, the Village of Dixmoor, the Village of Palos Park, the City of Palos Heights, the City of Palos Hills, the Village of Posen and the Village of Worth.

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### ORDINANCE NO. 2016

### AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF CRESTWOOD PROVIDING FOR AUTHORITY TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH SOUTHWEST CENTRAL DISPATCH AND SOUTHWEST CENTRAL 9-1-1 SYSTEM

WHEREAS, the Village of Crestwood (the "Village") has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs and that protect the public health, safety, and welfare of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Crestwood has previously obtained dispatch services for fire and police services from the Village of Alsip; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Alsip has provided notice to the Village of Crestwood of termination of the existing agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Crestwood have determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of Crestwood to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A with Southwest Central Dispatch, an Intergovernmental Cooperation Association, and Southwest Central 9-1-1 System, an Intergovernmental Cooperation Association and Emergency Telephone System Board, which Associations/Emergency Telephone System Board will collectively provide wire line and wireless Enhanced 911 services and other emergency and non-emergency dispatching services to the citizens of Crestwood.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Crestwood, as follows:

Section 1. Recitals. The facts and statements contained in the preamble to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Ordinance.

Section 2. Approval of Agreements. The Agreement as presented is hereby approved by the Village.

Section 3. Debts and Liabilities. The Village hereby accepts and agrees to pay its allocable portion of all existing and future debts and liabilities of the Southwest Central Dispatch and Southwest Central 9-1-1 System, including, but not limited to, those costs set out in Article 8 of Southwest Central Dispatch's By-laws and to pay all costs required of a member set out in Southwest Central Dispatch's By-laws and Southwest Central 9-1-1 By-laws.

Section 4. Adherence to Requirements. The Village accepts and agrees to comply with all requirements of Southwest Central Dispatch's By-laws and Southwest Central 9-1-1 By-laws, including all the requirements of Southwest Central Dispatch's By-laws and Southwest Central 9-1-1 By-laws relating to new members.

Section 5. Authority to Execute Documents. The Mayor and Village Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute Southwest Central Dispatch's Joint Public Safety Agreement and Southwest Central 9-1-1 System's Intergovernmental Agreement for New Members, as well as all other documents necessary to ensure Southwest Central Dispatch and Southwest Central 9-1-1 System will collectively provide wire line and wireless enhanced 911 services and other emergency and non-emergency dispatching services to the citizens of Crestwood.

Section 6. Repeal of Prior Ordinances. Ordinance Number 2012, previously enacted on July 1, 2010, and Ordinance Number 2013, previously enacted on July 1, 2010, and Ordinance 2015, enacted on August 19, 2010, be and are hereby repealed.

Section 7. Severability. If any provision of this Ordinance or the application of any provision of this Ordinance is held unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such occurrence shall not affect other provisions of this Ordinance or their application that can be given effect without the unconstitutional or invalid provision or its application. Each unconstitutional or invalid provision or application of such provision is severable unless otherwise provided by this Ordinance.

Section 8. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval and publication as required by law.

#### AGREEMENT

This Agreement is entered into between the Village of Crestwood ("Crestwood"), Southwest Central Dispatch ("SWCD"), and Southwest Central 9-1-1 System ("SWC911) on the 19th day of August, 2010 (Crestwood, SWCD, and SWC911 sometimes hereinafter referred to individually as a "Party" and collectively as "Parties); and

Whereas, Crestwood applied to become a new member of SWCD and a new member of Southwest Central 9-1-1 System ("SWC911"), in accordance with the applicable By-Laws of SWCD and SWC911, and

Whereas, Crestwood requested that SWCD's Board of Directors approve certain incentives for Crestwood's membership in accordance with Section 3.2A of SWCD's By-Laws, those incentives being set out in a certain Crestwood letter dated March 30, 2010, a copy of which is attached hereto; and

Whereas, as stated in the aforesaid Crestwood March 30, 2010 letter, and as required by Section 3.2A of SWCD's By-laws, Crestwood agrees not to deliver to SWCD or SWC911 an effective notice of withdrawal as a member of SWCD or an effective notice of withdrawal as a member of SWC911, as defined in Article 11 of SWCD's By-Laws and Article VII of SWC911's By-Laws, until Crestwood has paid the full assessment required to be paid by SWCD's members for a period of two years, and agrees further that Crestwood will abide by the dates set forth in paragraph 3 below pertaining to the date Crestwood may deliver an effective notice of withdrawal to SWC911; and

Whereas, Crestwood acknowledges and agrees that Article 3 of SWCD's By-Laws requires a new member to conform to the requirements of Article 3 in order to become a new member; and

Whereas, Crestwood acknowledges and agrees that Article II of SWC911's By-laws requires a new member to conform to the requirements of Article II in order to become a new member; and

Whereas, Crestwood passed its Ordinance 2015 on August 19, 2010, agreeing to be bound by the terms and provisions of the SWCD Joint Public Safety Agreement and the By-Laws of SWCD; and

Whereas, Crestwood passed its Ordinance 2015 on August 19, 2010, agreeing to be bound by the terms and provisions of the SWC911 Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement for new members and SWC911's By-laws; and

Whereas, on April 21, 2010, SWCD's Board of Directors conditionally approved Crestwood's request to become a new member and conditionally accepted Crestwood as a new member in accordance with SWCD's applicable By-Laws and approved the incentives requested by Crestwood in its March 30, 2010 letter, and, in addition, on April 21, 2010, SWC911's Board of Directors conditionally approved Crestwood's request to become a new member of SWC911 and conditionally accepted Crestwood as a new member in accordance with SWC911's applicable By-Laws; the conditions to be satisfied being: (1) entering into this Agreement; and (2) providing all necessary documents and paying all costs required by SWCD's and SWC911's respective By-Laws; and

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Whereas, in accordance with the directive of SWCD's Board of Directors, Crestwood shall pay fifty percent (50%) of the existing assessment for one year from the date SWCD and SWC911 begin providing dispatch services to Crestwood after the Illinois Commerce Commission approves SWCD's and SWC911's amended service plan, and seventy-five percent (75%) of the existing assessment for one year from the first anniversary of the date SWCD and SWC911 begin providing dispatch services to Crestwood after the Illinois Commerce (75%) of the existing assessment for one year from the first anniversary of the date SWCD and SWC911 begin providing dispatch services to Crestwood after the Illinois Commerce Commission approves SWCD's and SWC911's amended service plan, and, thereafter, shall pay one hundred percent (100%) of the existing assessment; and

Whereas, Crestwood intends to install receivers within the geographical boundaries of Crestwood, to wit: one police receiver and one fire receiver at 13840 S. Cicero, Crestwood, Illinois 60445 (hereinafter "the Crestwood two receiver sites"), which Crestwood two receiver sites will be utilized by SWCD and SWC911 in providing dispatching services to Crestwood, other members of SWCD, and members and contract members of SWC911, and which two receiver sites will be maintained by SWCD.

Now, therefore, in consideration of SWCD's and SWC911's acceptance of Crestwood as a member of SWCD and a member of SWC911, the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, other valuable consideration hereby acknowledged as received by Crestwood, and in accordance with the requirements of SWCD's and SWC911's respective By-Laws:

1. The foregoing Recitals are incorporated herein and made a part of this Agreement, and the Parties agree that this Agreement shall be interpreted in accordance with said Recitals.

2. Crestwood agrees it will provide SWCD and SWC911 all necessary documents and pay all costs required to comply with SWCD's By-Laws for a new member and SWC911's By-Laws for a new member.

3. Crestwood agrees that it will not deliver to SWCD or SWC911 an effective notice of withdrawal, as defined in Article 11 of SWCD's By-Laws and Article VII of SWC911's Bylaws, earlier than May 1, 2015, and that any delivery of a notice of withdrawal prior to May 1, 2015, will be deemed null and void, unless SWCD and SWC911, in their sole discretion, upon receipt from Crestwood of a notice of withdrawal prior to May 1, 2015, thereafter delivers written notice to Crestwood that SWCD and SWC911will accept Crestwood's notice of withdrawal filed prior to May 1, 2015, then said notice will be deemed an effective notice of withdrawal within the meaning of Article 11 of SWCD's By-Laws and Article VII of SWC911's By-laws, and Crestwood shall be allowed to withdraw in accordance with the dictates of Article 11 of SWCD's By-laws and Article VII of SWC911's By-laws. Crestwood acknowledges and agrees that in the event Crestwood does withdraw from SWCD or SWC911 prior to May 1, 2015, for any reason and in the absence of SWCD's and SWC911's notice it will accept Crestwood's notice of withdrawal filed prior to May 1, 2015, Crestwood shall immediately thereafter be obligated to pay SWCD, within 30 days after Crestwood's effective date of withdrawal the difference between the amount of the assessments which would have been paid by Crestwood in accordance with SWCD's By-Laws absent the incentives approved by SWCD, and the amount of the assessments actually paid by Crestwood while it was a member of SWCD and a member of SWC911.

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4. Crestwood agrees that if and when Crestwood withdraws from SWCD and SWC911, SWCD and SWC911 shall be entitled to utilize the Crestwood two receiver sites for a period of two years after the effective date of Crestwood's withdrawal from SWCD and SWC911 and that Crestwood will take all necessary action to ensure SWCD and SWC911 may utilize the Crestwood two receiver sites for a period of two years from the effective date of Crestwood's withdrawal from SWCD and SWC911 may utilize the Crestwood two receiver sites for a period of two years from the effective date of Crestwood's withdrawal from SWCD and SWC911.

5. In the event Crestwood fails to perform its obligations and promises as set out in this Agreement, Crestwood shall be in default, and, in addition to any and all other remedies which SWCD and SWC911 may have against Crestwood in law or equity, Crestwood shall be liable to SWCD and SWC911 for all costs and expenses incurred by SWCD and SWC911 in enforcing their respective rights hereunder, including, without limitation, court costs and reasonable attorney fees.

6. The persons signing this Agreement on behalf of Crestwood represent and warrant they have actual authority from Crestwood to execute this Agreement and bind Crestwood to the provisions of this Agreement and, further, that all procedures required to be fulfilled by the laws of the State of Illinois and the ordinances and laws of Crestwood to grant actual authority to the persons signing this Agreement to bind Crestwood have previously been satisfied.

7. This Agreement shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois.

8. This Agreement shall be deemed to have been drafted by the Parties, and the rule of law that a contract shall be construed strictly against the drafter of the contract shall not apply to this Agreement.

This Agreement made and entered into between the Southwest Central 9-1-1 System, an Intergovernmental Cooperation Association and Emergency Telephone System Board and SWCD Central Dispatch, a Public Safety Answering Point, (herein after referred to as "SWCD") and the Oak Lawn Emergency Regional Communications, a 9-1-1 Authority and a Public Safety Answering Point (hereinafter referred to as "OLREC").

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, SWCD currently provides Enhanced 9-1-1 service to the cities of Countryside, Palos Heights, Palos Hills; the Village of Chicago Ridge, Crestwood, Indian Head Park, Lemont, Palos Park and Worth; and

WHEREAS, under Illinois law an ETSB is required to select a location for alternate routing when all 9-1-1 lines to the primary Public Safety Answering Point ("PSAP") are busy or if the primary PSAP closes down for a period of time due to an emergency situation; and

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 10 of the 1970 Illinois Constitution and Chapter 127, Section 748 of the Illinois Revised Statues authorize an intergovernmental cooperation to enter into contracts with units of local government; and

WHEREAS, SWCD and OLREC mutually desire to enter into an Agreement establishing OLREC as the location for alternate routing of 9-1-1 calls when all 9-1-1 lines to SWCD are busy or in the event that SWCD closes down for a period of time due to an emergency situation,

NOW, THEREFOR, in consideration of the above premises, and also the mutual covenants contained herein, SWCD and OLREC do herby agree as follows:

- Beginning upon the effective date of this Agreement, when, at any time, the 9-1-1 lines of SWCD serviced by the AT&T Elk Grove Tandem Office are busy or in the event that SWCD closes down for a period of time due to an emergency situation, SWCD shall instruct AT&T to reroute these 9-1-1 calls to OLREC via their designated 9-1-1 trunks. OLREC agrees to process all calls rerouted to OLREC as set out above.
- 2. When there is a need for alternate routing, SWCD will contact OLREC and advise the reason for the alternate routing request, the length of time the

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alternate routing will need to be in effect (if possible), provide personnel from SWCD to assist OLREC and provide an estimated time of arrival of the SWCD personnel to assist at OLREC dispatch center.

- 3. OLREC agrees to serve as SWCD'S backup PSAP without any compensation, except as provided in this agreement.
- 4. Any notice permitted or required to be given hereunder by SWCD or OLREC shall be in writing and shall be personally delivered or mailed, by registered or certified U.S. Mail, postage prepaid, return receipt required, to the party to receive the same as follows:

Unless otherwise terminated, this Agreement shall remain in effect perpetually until either SWCD or OLREC notifies the other, by means of a one hundred twenty (120) day notice, that this Agreement shall be terminated on a date certain no less then one hundred twenty (120) after service of notice to terminate this Agreement.
- 6. If in the event a Court of proper jurisdiction determines that any paragraph or paragraphs of this Agreement are invalid the parties agree that such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Agreement.
- 7. This Agreement is not assignable by SWCD or OLREC and any purported assignment of this Agreement by SWCD or OLREC shall be null and void, provided however SWCD or OLREC shall be entitled to assign this agreement to any successor entity of SWCD or OLREC.

- 8. The persons signing the Agreement on behalf of SWCD or OLREC warrant that they have actual authority to enter into this agreement on behalf of SWCD and OLREC respectively.
- 9. This Agreement constitutes the complete, final, and entire Agreement between SWCD and OLREC regarding the subject matter of this agreement and supersedes any prior agreements, either written or oral, between the parties.
- 10. Any modification to this Agreement must be in writing and signed by both SWCD and OLREC.

The legislative intent is that 9-1-1 is used for emergency calls only. Therefore, all calls of an administrative or nonemergency nature shall be referred to your agency's published telephone number.

The Southwest Central 9-1-1 System PSAP agrees to keep all records, times, and places of all calls. All records will be available to all participants of the 9-1-1 System.

It shall be the responsibility of your agency to maintain the report of the call and the disposition of each call received. NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, SWC911 and DU PAGE do herby agree as follows:

- 1.
