Plan Narrative:

The Chicago Heights PSAP will close and join Cook County 911. The Chicago Heights ETSB is being dissolved and will join the Cook County ETSB. AT&T has determined that Cook County ETSB has the capacity to add the Chicago Heights call load into its existing infrastructure without any changes. Cook County ETSB has a redundant backup center located in Maywood. The backup center is tested every Monday. Overflow calls are routed to NW Central Dispatch and SW Central Dispatch in the event that staff is commuting from Des Plaines to Maywood. The network route from Des Plaines to Maywood is through a closed circuit OPT-E-Man and backed up through a microwave connection. Each location can work independently on its own phone controller.

FIVE YEAR STRATEGIC PLAN FOR MODIFIED PLAN

Narrative:

In anticipation of future consolidations, the Cook County Emergency Telephone System Board and the Cook County Sheriff's Office began expanding 911 operations in July of 2015. Currently the main center in Des Plaines has 32 positions. This includes 25 full dispatch positions, 4 call taking positions and 3 positions that are built and waiting for computer equipment.

The Maywood backup center, which was renovated in 2017, has 19 dispatch positions.

The design of the Cook County next generation capable phone system from Zetron is unique in that it provides redundancy with a full independent system at the primary site and the backup site. The system allows operators to select which controller they are using which essentially allow the backup center to work simultaneously with the primary site. This increases the active call positions to 48 operator positions.

The center has made significant investments in its infrastructure over the past 5 years. This has prepared the center to accept new consolidations over the next few years without passing along the cost of technology or infrastructure to its contract dispatch agencies.

RESOLUTION TO ACCEPT THE CITY OF CHICAGO HEIGHTS INTO THE COOK COUNTY 9-1-1 SYSTEM

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted the Emergency Telephone System Act, 50 ILCS 750/0.01 et seq. ("Act") which enables a county to impose a surcharge on billed subscribers of network connections provided by telecommunications carriers at a rate per network connection in order to implement and maintain a 911 Emergency Telephone System; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 26-79 of Ordinance Number 01-O-35 of the Cook County Code of Ordinances ("Ordinance"), the Cook County Emergency Telephone System Board ("ETSB") has the authority to plan and implement a 9-1-1 system and receive monies from the surcharge imposed under the Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 50 ILCS 15.4(a)(2), the City of Chicago Heights has requested that it be included in the Cook County 9-1-1 System and has agreed to the payment of the surcharge for such 9-1-1 services as established by the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the ETSB has agreed to accept the City of Chicago Heights into the Cook County 9-1-1 System subject to approval by the Illinois State Police.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to a request by the City of Chicago Heights, the ETSB hereby approves the inclusion of the City of Chicago Heights within the Cook County 9-1-1 System to commence upon the approval of the Statewide 911 Administrator of the Illinois State Police. Upon such approval, all telecommunications carriers shall be notified to impose the applicable surcharge rate for such 9-1-1 services as established by the State of Illinois upon all customers located within the City of Chicago Heights.

WHEREAS, to comply with the Public Act 99-0006, which amended the Act to corporate authorities have determined that it is in the best interest of the City as the City has entered into an intergovernmental agreement with the County of Cook for the County to provide dispatch services for the City; and

WHEREAS, the Cook County Sheriff's Office will process 9-1-1 calls and provide other services for the 9-1-1 system, including call taking, dispatching and radio monitoring as operated by the Cook County Emergency Telephone System Board and the City's ETSB is no longer required to perform those duties.

THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of the City of Chicago Heights, County of Cook, and State of Illinois, as follows:

SECTION ONE:

The recitals set forth hereinabove shall be and are hereby incorporated as findings of fact as if said recitals were fully set forth herein.

SECTION TWO:

That upon the effective date of this Ordinance the City's ETSB shall be dissolved and Chapter 12, Sections 31 through 33 of the City of Chicago Heights Code of Ordinances shall be repealed.

SECTION THREE:

This Ordinance shall become in full force and effect on December 1, 2021 and upon passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COOK COUNTY EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM BOARD AND THE CITY OF CHICAGO HEIGHTS (Distribution of 911 Surcharge Funds)

This Intergovernmental Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into by and between the Cook County Emergency Telephone System Board ("ETSB") and the City of Chicago Heights ("City") (individually a "Party" and collectively the "Parties").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the ETSB operates the Cook County 9-1-1 system ("County 9-1-1 System") in unincorporated areas of Cook County and certain municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted the Emergency Telephone System Act, 50 ILCS 750/0.01, *et seq.* ("Act") which enables a county to impose a surcharge on billed subscribers of network connections provided by telecommunications carriers at a rate per network connection in order to implement and maintain a 911 Emergency Telephone System ("Surcharge Funds"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 50 ILCS 750/15.4(a)(2), the City has requested that it be included in the County 9-1-1 System and the ETSB has agreed to accept the City into the County 9-1-1 System; and

WHEREAS, the consolidation of the City with the Cook County ETSB shall be effective upon approval by the Illinois State Police 9-1-1 Authority ("Approval Date"); and

WHEREAS, the ETSB receives the Surcharge Funds allocated for each member of the ETSB from the Illinois State Police and the City has agreed to use a specified percentage of those Surcharge Funds to reimburse the ETSB for the use of the County 9-1-1 System including 9-1-1 Center operations and technology; and

WHEREAS, the City and ETSB have agreed that fifty percent (50%) of the City's Surcharge Funds shall be forwarded by the ETSB to the Cook County Sheriff's Office for the payment of a portion of the City's dispatch costs payable to the Sheriff's Office.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements set forth herein, the Parties agree as follows:

1. INCORPORATION OF RECITALS

The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein as though fully set forth herein.

2. TERM

The term of this Agreement shall commence on the Approval Date, which is the date of consolidation approval by the Statewide 9-1-1 Administrator ("Effective Date") or November 30, 2021, whichever is later, and shall continue as long as City is a member of the ETSB ("Term").

3. TERMINATION

Either the ETSB or City may terminate this Agreement at any time after the first five (5) years upon three hundred sixty-five (365) days written notice. The Agreement may not be terminated during the first five (5) years except by reason of a party's default.

4. DISTRIBUTION OF CITY SURCHARGE FUNDS

The Parties agree that 50% of the City's Surcharge Funds shall be paid by the ETSB, on behalf of the City, to the Cook County Sheriff's Office ("Sheriff") to reimburse the Sheriff for dispatch services pursuant to an Intergovernmental Agreement between the City and the Sheriff dated February 25, 2021, and the remaining 50% of the City's Surcharge Funds will constitute reimbursement to the ETSB for the support of the 9-1-1 Center's operations and technology ("ETSB Reimbursement"). The ETSB shall make such reimbursement payments quarterly based on the ETSB's fiscal year with any partial year prorated based on the number of days this Agreement has been in effect for that year. The Parties agree that in the event the Illinois State Police or the State of Illinois fail to distribute the Surcharge Funds to the ETSB by the Illinois State Police or the State of Illinois. The ETSB Reimbursement of the City's Surcharge Funds to both the Sheriff and ETSB until such time as the Surcharge Funds are distributed to the ETSB by the Illinois State Police or the State of Illinois. The ETSB Reimbursement shall be a limited obligation of the City payable only from 50% of the City's Surcharge Funds. Nothing herein shall be construed to represent a pledge of the City's taxing authority or a lien against any other City funds.

5. INDEMNIFICATION

The City agrees to indemnify, defend, save and hold the ETSB and its agents, officers, and employees harmless from and against any and all liabilities, claims, demands or suits brought by any employee of City pursuant to this Agreement or by any member of the public arising out of any negligent act or omission of City and/or its agents, officers, or employees in the performance of this Agreement. The ETSB shall be responsible for the acts of its agents, officers, or employees in the performance of this Agreement. Nothing herein shall waive any immunities either Party may assert in response or defense of any such claims.

6. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

In the event of a dispute between the City and the ETSB concerning this Agreement, each shall designate a representative who shall meet to resolve the dispute. If the designated representatives fail to resolve the dispute, then the City's General Counsel and the ETSB's Attorney are responsible for promptly resolving the dispute in good faith and in a cooperative manner. In the event the Parties are not able to resolve any dispute, each Party retains all rights and remedies at law or in equity.

7. NOTICE

Unless otherwise specified, any notice, demand or request required hereunder shall be given in writing at the addresses set forth below, by any of the following means: (a) personal service during regular business hours; (b) facsimile transmission during regular business hours; (c) overnight courier; or (d) first class mail properly addressed with postage prepaid and deposited in the U. INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF COOK ON BEHALF OF THE COOK COUNTY SHERIFF AND THE CITY OF CHICAGO HEIGHTS

This Intergovernmental Agreement ("IGA") is entered into by and between the County of Cook ("County") on behalf of the Sheriff of Cook County ("Sheriff") and the City of Chicago Heights ("Chicago Heights"), (collectively, the "Parties"), pursuant to authority granted by the Illinois Constitution of 1970, Article VII, Section 10, and The Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq.

I. RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Cook County Emergency Telephone Systems Board ("ETSB") operates the Cook County 9-1-1 System ("9-1-1 System") in the unincorporated areas of Cook County and certain municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff processes 9-1-1 calls and provides other services for the 9-1-1 System, including call taking, dispatching, and radio monitoring; and

WHEREAS, the budget for the Sheriff's Office, through the Annual Appropriation Bill adopted by the County Board, currently funds the salary and benefits for in excess of sixty employees who currently staff the 9-1-1 System's communication center; and

WHEREAS, Chicago Heights desires to obtain the Sheriff's 9-1-1 System dispatching services for the Chicago Heights Police Department ("Chicago Heights PD") and agrees to reimburse the Sheriff for providing said services pursuant to this IGA; and

WIIEREAS, the Sheriff agrees to provide 9-1-1 System dispatching/monitoring services to Chicago Heights PD twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week; and

WHEREAS, the ETSB receives the Surcharge Funds allocated for each member of the ETSB from the Illinois State Police and Chicago Heights has agreed to use a specified percentage of those Surcharge Funds to reimburse the ETSB for the use of the County 9-1-1 System including 9-1-1 Center operations and technology; and

WHEREAS, Chicago Heights and the ETSB agreed that fifty percent (50%) of Chicago Heights's Surcharge Funds shall be forwarded by the ETSB to the Cook County Sheriff's Office for the payment of a portion of Chicago Heights's dispatch costs payable to the Sheriff; and

WHEREAS, the County, the Sheriff and Chicago Heights seek to enter into this IGA where the Sheriff will provide dispatch services to Chicago Heights PD.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements set forth herein, the Parties agree as follows:

II. INCORPORATION OF RECITALS

The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein as though fully set forth.

III. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- A. Term: The term of this IGA shall begin upon approval by the Statewide 911 Administrator ("Effective Date") and shall continue for five (5) years from the Effective Date ("Termination Date"). The term of this Agreement shall automatically renew for additional, consecutive five (5) year terms unless either party delivers notice of intent not to renew at least one hundred eighty (180) days prior to the expiration of the term or renewal term.
- **B.** Termination: Either the Sheriff or Chicago Heights may terminate this IGA at any time after the first Term upon one (1) year's written notice.

C. Roles and Responsibilities:

- The Sheriff agrees to provide 9-1-1 System dispatching services to Chicago Heights twenty-four (24) hours per day, seven (7) days per week. Chicago Heights PD dispatch will be done on a Cook County 800 mhz frequency. The scope of dispatching services the Sheriff will provide to Chicago Heights will include all related services customarily and incidentally provided by other PSAPs in the Chicago metropolitan area.
- 2) Chicago Heights will adhere to current 9-1-1 Center procedures covering radio use and officer safety practices mandated by the Sheriff's Office.
- 3) Chicago Heights will only be allowed to have TDMA capable radios on the Sherift's radio system.
- 4) The Sheriff will retain all dispatch records in accordance with 83 Ill. Adm. Code 1325 and make them available to Chicago Heights upon request in a manner designed to permit Chicago Heights to comply with lawful subpoenas, court orders and Freedom of Information requests. In the event that Chicago Heights terminates its contract the Sheriff will export historical CAD data to Chicago Heights.

D. Operational Reimbursement

 Chicago Heights agrees to reimburse the Sheriff's Office on a monthly basis, with the first invoice being sent prior to commencement of services, for all personnel and operational costs associated with this IGA, including but not limited to costs associated with any additional positions necessary for performance of services ("Sheriff's Reimbursement"). Reimbursements shall take place in accordance with the following schedule, with any partial year prorated based the number of days the IGA has been in effect for that year:

> 1st year of service - \$516,707.00 2nd year of service - \$537,445.00 3rd year of service - \$557,805.00 4th year of service - \$578,908.00 5th year of service - \$602,360.00

- 2) Sheriff will send Chicago Heights a monthly invoice. Payment to Sheriff will be due within thirty (30) days of receipt of invoice.
- 3) Pursuant to a separate Intergovernmental Agreement between ETSB and Chicago Heights, ETSB shall forward fifty percent (50%) of Chicago Heights's Surcharge Funds to the Sheriff for the payment of a portion of Chicago Heights's dispatch costs. For example, in 2019 the Surcharge Funds collected for Chicago Heights were \$475,000. Pursuant to the Intergovernmental Agreement between ETSB and Chicago Heights, ETSB would forward \$237,500, or fifty percent, to the Sheriff for the payment of a portion of Chicago Heights's dispatch costs payable to the Sheriff. ETSB's obligation to forward Surcharge Funds to the Sheriff is contingent upon the full execution of the aforementioned separate Intergovernmental Agreement between ETSB and Chicago Heights.

IV. INDEMNIFICATION

- A. Chicago Heights agrees to indemnify, defend, save and hold the County and the Sheriff, and their respective Commissioners, agents, officers, and employees harmless from and against any and all liabilities, claims, demands or suits brought by any employee of Chicago Heights pursuant to this IGA or member of the public arising out of any negligent act or omission of Chicago Heights and/or its agents, officers, or employees in the performance of this IGA.
- **B.** The County shall be responsible for the acts of its agents, officers, or employees in the performance of this IGA.
- C. The Parties each acknowledge and represent that they are presently insured through insurance with a financially sound and reputable insurance company, self-insurance or risk pooling agreement in such amounts and covering such risks as the Parties reasonably believe are sufficient for their performance under this IGA. Upon either Party's request, the other Party shall deliver evidence of the scope and amount of insurance coverage carried by such Party that covers the risks arising from their performance under this IGA.

V. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

In the event of a dispute between Chicago Heights and the Sheriff concerning this IGA, each shall designate a representative who shall meet to resolve the dispute. If the designated representatives fail to resolve the dispute, then the Sheriff's General Counsel and Chicago Heights's General Counsel are responsible for promptly resolving the dispute in good faith and in a cooperative manner. If the respective General Counsel cannot resolve the dispute in a cooperative manner, either party may seek any remedies available in law or equity in the Circuit Court of Cook County.

8). NORTHWEST agrees to serve as COUNTY'S backup PSAP without any compensation.

9). Any notice or other communication permitted or required to be given hereunder by COUNTY or NORTHWBST shall be in writing and shall be personally delivered or mailed, by registered or certified U.S. mail, postage prepaid, return receipt required, to the party to receive the same as follows:

13). Any modifications to this Agreement must be in writing and signed by both COUNTY and NORTHWEST to be effective.

14). This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois.

TEST PLAN DESCRIPTION

1) Description of test plan (back-up, overflow, failure, database).

The Cook County ETSB has enough capacity to add the city of Chicago Heights to its existing system without the need for any additional lines. The main Cook County Dispatch site is located at 9511 W Harrison in Des Plaines. In the event of a phone line failure, the 9-1-1 lines can either manually be switched over in Des Plaines by staff or switched by the 9-1-1 Resolution Center to Northwest Central Dispatch System and/or Southwest Central Dispatch by the selective router. The CC ETSB has a backup center located in the Sheriff's Police Headquarters at 1401 S Maybrook Dr in Maywood. This location is tested on a monthly basis by 9-1-1 center staff and is coordinated with the 9-1-1 resolution center. Northwest Central Dispatch and Southwest Central Dispatch can handle overflow calls in the event a trunk is busy at the CC ETSB. The current phone system, which is Zetron Call Max, is connected from Des Plaines to Maywood through an Opt-E-Man Circuit and has a backup of a point to point microwave connection. In the event that both paths were disturbed the Zetron controllers can function independently in both locations. The connection between Maywood and Des Plaines is not needed in order to have redundancy. Testing will be conducted with AT&T from wireline, wireless and VOIP providers prior to cutover to ensure all network changes made by AT&T are successful.
