ORDER OF THE STATEWIDE 9-1-1 ADMINISTRATOR

WHEREAS, the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Recommendations of Administrative Law Judge Donald W. Seasock, in the above-captioned case have been read and examined; and

WHEREAS, the record has been read and reviewed;

WHEREAS, the Statewide 9-1-1 Advisory Board held a hearing on January 29, 2018 on this Request for Consolidation, at which hearing, the Statewide 9-1-1 Advisory Board voted to recommend approval of the Request for Consolidation;

WHEREAS, the rulings of the Administrative Law Judge on admission of evidence and all motions are correct and hereby concurred in by the Administrator; and

WHEREAS, the Administrator finds that the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, as stated in the Recommended Decision, are correct, they are hereby adopted as the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law of the Administrator.

NOW THEREFORE, the Administrator adopts the recommendations as set forth in the Recommended Decision:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that pursuant to the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, as set forth in the Recommended Decision, and upon the advice and recommendation of the Statewide 9-1-1 Advisory Board, that the Skokie Police/Fire Communications Center request for approval of its Lincolnwood consolidation plan pursuant to Section 15.4a of the Emergency Telephone System Act, 50 ILCS 750/15.4a, is approved.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Skokie Police/Fire Communications Center consolidation will be completed no later than February 28, 2018.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Skokie Police/Fire Communications Center 9-1-1 System Service Provider will conduct a P.01 Study and if necessary a Traffic Study to determine the number of 9-1-1 trunks required to serve Lincolnwood in advance of completing the consolidation.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Skokie Police/Fire Communications Center will file with the Administrator a Wireless 9-1-1 Plan to include Lincolnwood for all Carriers no later than March 1, 2018 with an effective date no later than March 30, 2018. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Skokie Police/Fire Communications Center shall begin to receive surcharge payments as defined in 50 ILCS 750/30 beginning February 1, 2018.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Lincolnwood ETSB will transfer any reserve fund balance to the Skokie Police/Fire Communications Center by April 1, 2018.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Lincolnwood will submit a close out Annual Financial Report (AFR) by April 1, 2018 that will include the reporting of surcharge and other revenue received, and expenditures (Tab 2) for the period of January 1, 2018 through January 31, 2018 when the surcharge is scheduled to be transitioned to the Skokie Police/Fire Communications Center. Failure to do so will result in withholding of surcharge.

This Order is a final administrative decision of the Statewide 9-1-1 Administrator subject to review under the Administrative Review Law, 735 ILCS 5/3-101. In the event you wish to seek review of or appeal this Order, you are advised:

- 1. Every action seeking review of such final decision shall be commenced by the filing of a Complaint and the issuance of Summons in the Circuit Court within 35 days from the date a copy of the decision was served upon the parties.
- 2. In your action seeking review you must name in the Complaint, and issue a Summons for, each party of record to the case other than yourself.
- 3. Attached below is a list of all parties of record to this case, including the name and address of the agency or officer entering the Order, and the addresses of each party where the parties may be served with pleadings, notices, or service of process for any review or further proceedings.
- 4. You are not required to file any motion or request for reconsideration with the Department or the Statewide 9-1-1 Administrator before filing your action for review in the Circuit Court. The administrative rules of the Department do not require or allow for any further proceedings before the Statewide 9-1-1 Administrator.
