Conclusions:

Under 50 ILCS 750 Section 15.4a(1)(4), any county with a population of at least 250,000 that has a single Emergency Telephone System Board or qualified governmental entity and more than 2 PSAPs, the 9-1-1 Authority shall reduce the number of PSAPs by at least 50% or to 2 PSAPs, whichever is greater. Kane County currently has 3 PSAPs, so it must close at least one PSAP.

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Kane County was granted a waiver to allow for completion of an intergovernmental agreement with the Naperville ETSB to opt City of Aurora and the Village of North Aurora out of the Kane County 911 system into the Naperville 911 system. This plan modification addresses Kane County's opt out portion of the intergovernmental agreement. The Naperville 911 system also filed a plan modification opting the City of Aurora and the Village of North Aurora in to its 911 system.

With this modification, Kane County will have two remaining PSAPs which fulfills the requirement to reduce its PSAPs by 50% or to two. This modification will be complete on or about December 1, 2017.
