Conclusions:

The MCD Joint ETSB consolidation plan generally meets the requirements for a consolidation plan as prescribed by Section 1324.200(c) of Illinois Admin. Code Part 1324.200 – Consolidation of 9-1-1 Emergency Systems except there is a missing ordinance for Norridge and Schiller Park.

Under 50 ILCS 15.4a(a)(2), in any county with a population of at least 250,000 that has more than one Emergency Telephone System Board, or qualified governmental entity, any 9-1-1 Authority serving a population of less than 25,000 shall be consolidated such that no 9-1-1 Authority in the county serves a population of less than 25,000. Schiller Park, Norridge and Harwood Heights serve populations less than 25,000. In 2015, Schiller Park served a population of approximately 11,806, Norridge served 14,621, and Harwood

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Heights served 8,635. As a result, all three ETSBs are required to consolidate. All three 9-1-1 authorities will dissolve their respective ETSBs and create the MCD Joint ETSB pursuant to an intergovernmental agreement. The combined population served by the MCD Joint ETSB will be 35,062 which meets the population requirement.

It is recommended that the Statewide 9-1-1 Administrator not issue an order of approval until such time that the ordinance dissolving the Norridge ETSB and an ordinance authorizing the creation of a Joint ETSB for Schiller Park are provided.
