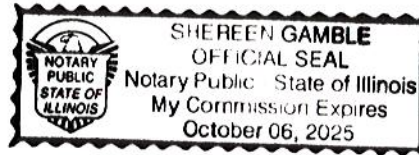

FIVE YEAR STRATEGIC PLAN FOR MODIFIED PLAN

(Provide a detailed summary of the proposed system's operation, including but not limited to, a five-year strategic plan for implementation of the modified 9-1-1 plan with financial projections)

Narrative:

In anticipation of future consolidations, the Cook County Emergency Telephone System Board and the Cook County Sheriff's Office began expanding 911 operations in July of 2015. Currently the main center in Des Plaines has 32 positions. This includes 25 full dispatch positions, 4 call taking positions and 3 positions that are built and waiting for computer equipment.

The Maywood backup center, which was renovated in 2017, has 19 dispatch positions.

The design of the Cook County next generation capable phone system from Zetron is unique in that it provides redundancy with a full independent system at the primary site and the backup site. The system allows operators to select which controller they are using which essentially allow the backup center to work simultaneously with the primary site. This increases the active call positions to 48 operator positions.

The center has made significant investments in its infrastructure over the past 5 years. This has prepared the center to accept new consolidations over the next few years without passing along the cost of technology or infrastructure to its contract dispatch agencies.

The Cook County PSAP receiving a call for emergency services in your jurisdiction shall dispatch the call in the following manner:

Primary Telephone transfer via your agency's primary routing number as identified by AT&T.
Secondary via your agency's 10-digit emergency number
Tertiary ISPERN or point to point radio.

Aid Outside Jurisdiction Boundaries

Once an emergency unit is dispatched in response to a request through the system, such unit shall render its service to the requesting party without regard to whether the unit is operating outside its normal jurisdictional boundaries. The legislative intent is that 9-1-1 be used for emergency calls only. Therefore, all calls of an administrative or non-emergency nature shall be referred to your agency's published telephone number.

The PSAP Center agrees to keep all records, times, and places of all calls. All records will be available to all participants of the 9-1-1 System according to State of Illinois Administrative Rules and internal policy. It shall be the responsibility of your agency to maintain the report of call and the disposition of each call.

There is no need to respond to this notification unless it is your desire to modify this agreement or withdraw from it. Unless we hear from you within ten (10) days, we will assume that agreement remains in full effect. **AGREEMENT RELATING TO THE TRANSFER AND REPORTING OF
SURCHARGE FUNDS RELATING TO THE VILLAGE OF ROBBINS,
ILLINOIS**

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Section 15.4a of the Emergency Telephone System Act 50ILCS 750/1 et seq. (the "Act") requires any Authority, as defined by the Act, in a county with a population of 250,000, to consolidate such that no 911-Authority in the county serves a population of less than 25,000; and

WHEREAS, Calumet Park Regional Joint 911 ETSB operates CalComm 911 for certain municipalities; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Act, Cook County ETSB operates in certain municipalities and unincorporated areas of Cook County; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 50 ILCS 15.4 (a) (2), the Village of Robbins has requested that it be included in the Cook County ETSB, and the Cook County ETSB has agreed to accept the Village of Robbins into their 911 system; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the bylaws adopted by the Calumet Park Regional Joint ETSB, the Village of Robbins has provided notice of its intended termination in the Calumet Park Regional Joint ETSB; and

WHEREAS, to facilitate the Village of Robbins's transition to the Cook County ETSB, the parties desire to enter into this Agreement to confirm their understanding that the Village of Robbins will cease to be a member of the Calumet Park Regional Joint ETSB, and will become a member of the Cook County ETSB; that, thereafter the boundaries for 911 calls for each party will change such that 911 emergency calls originating in the Village of Robbins will be handled by the Cook County ETSB.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and mutual covenants hereafter set forth, the parties agree as follows:

Section 1. Incorporation of Recitals

The foregoing preambles are hereby incorporated into this Agreement as if fully restated in this Section 1.

Section 2. Village Opt-Out

The Village of Robbins has provided the notice required by the Calumet Park Regional Joint ETSB's by-laws to terminate its status as a Calumet Park Regional Joint ETSB member municipality and upon approval of Cook County ETSB's plan by the State of Illinois' Office of the Statewide 911 Administrator, Village of Robbins shall become a member of the Cook County ETSB.

Section 3. Wireless Call Boundaries

Upon Village of Robbins becoming a Cook County ETSB member municipality, the wireless call boundaries of Calumet Park Regional Joint ETSB and Cook County ETSB shall change, such that

all wireless 911 calls originating within the Village of Robbins shall no longer be handled by Calumet Park Regional Joint ETSB, and instead shall be handled by Cook County ETSB.

Section 4. Funds

Once the consolidation plan is approved by the State of Illinois' Office of the Statewide 911 Administrator, Cook County ETSB shall receive all wireline funds attributable to the Village of Robbins in accordance with the Act. Cook County ETSB will be responsible for all funds it receives and for the reporting and auditing of all funds as described in Section 5 below.

Section 5. Financial Reporting of Funds

Calumet Park Regional Joint ETSB shall be responsible for all required reporting relating to any funds, including the financial report required by Section 40 of the Act, up to and including the date that Cook County ETSB's consolidation plan is approved by the State of Illinois' Office of the Statewide 911 Administrator. Thereafter Cook County ETSB shall be responsible for all such reporting.

Section 6. Term

The term of this agreement shall commence on the date the last signatory hereto signs ("Effective Date") and shall end as of the date upon which Calumet Park Regional Joint ETSB files the last financial report relating to any wireline funds attributable to the Village required by Section 5 hereof.

Section 7. Counterparts

This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original and both of which shall constitute one and the same Agreement.

Section 8. Severability

If any part of this Agreement is held invalid for any reason, the remainder of this Agreement shall remain valid to the maximum extent possible.

Section 9. Governing Law

This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Illinois without giving consideration to the principles of conflict of laws.


Section 10. Entire Agreement



**COUNTY'S ENHANCED 9-1-1 EMERGENCY TELEPHONE
SYSTEM ORDINANCE, AS AMENDED**

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted into law the Emergency Telephone System Act, Ill. Rev. Stat. ch. 134, para. 30.01 et. seq. (the Act) and

WHEREAS, the Act enables a County to impose a surcharge on billed subscribers of network connections provided by telecommunications carriers at a rate per network connection in order to implement and maintain a "9-1-1" Emergency Telephone System; and

WHEREAS, the Act further provides that before the surcharge may be imposed it must be authorized by a majority of voters in a referendum by the County; and

WHEREAS, the County Board of Cook, its' President, and commissioners deem it to be in the best interest of the County to implement and maintain an enhanced "9-1-1" Emergency Telephone System and to impose a surcharge on billed subscribers of network connections provided by the telecommunications carriers to pay for the cost associated therewith;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Commissioners of the County of Cook, Cook County Illinois as follows:

NEW CHAPTER - Surcharge for Emergency 9-1-1 Telephone System

Section One

A surcharge is hereby imposed, subject to the provisions of Section Two, upon all telephone subscribers passed through telecommunication carriers engaged in the business of transmitting messages by means of electricity originating within the corporate limits of Cook County. However, the surcharge may not be imposed, unless requested by a municipality, in any incorporated area which has previously approved a surcharge, or in any incorporated area where the corporate authorities have previously entered into a binding contract or letter of intent with a telecommunications carrier to provide 9-1-1 service through municipal funds.

If simultaneous to approval of the county referendum contained in this ordinance, a municipality approves a substantially similar referendum authorizing a surcharge for 9-1-1 services to be provided by the municipality, this ordinance does not apply to that municipality.

Section Two

A referendum shall be placed by the Cook County Clerk on the April 20, 1993, ballot for all legal voters residing in the Unincorporated areas of Cook County and Municipalities of Berkeley, Golf, Ford Heights, Northlake, Phoenix, Robbins, and Stone Park, to vote upon the following question:

Section Three

If a majority of the votes cast upon the question are in favor thereof, a surcharge is hereby imposed at a rate of \$1.25 per month per in service network connection, as hereinafter defined.

Section Four

As used in this Ordinance, the following terms shall have the following meanings: a) "network connection" and "transmitting messages" shall have the same meanings as in the Emergency Telephone System Act, Ill. Rev. Stat. ch. 134, para. 30.01 et seq. (1991); b) "telecommunications carrier" shall have the same meaning as Ill. Rev. Stat. ch. 111 2/3, para. 13-202; c) "board" means the Emergency Telephone System Board of Cook County created pursuant to Section 12 of this Ordinance.

Section Five

The Cook County Clerk shall provide any telecommunication carrier subject to the surcharge with a certified list of those network connections assigned to the municipalities or county to be exempt from imposition of the surcharge. The certified list may be revised by the County of Cook on 60 days prior written notice provided to the telecommunication carriers.

Section Six

The surcharge shall be imposed on the first day of the month following the expiration of 90 days from the date of the Cook County Clerk certifies to the individual telecommunication carriers subject to the surcharge that the referendum referred to in Section Two has passed.

Section Seven

Each telecommunications carrier is hereby authorized and instructed to recover accounting and collection charge, as provided in Section 8, by deducting 3% from the gross amount of surcharge collected otherwise due and owing the County of Cook prior to remittance under Section Eight of this ordinance.

Section Eight

The amount of surcharge collected by the telecommunications carrier shall be paid to the Emergency Telephone System Board of Cook County not later than 30 days after the surcharge is collected, net of any network or other 9-1-1 or sophisticated 9-1-1 system charges then due the particular telecommunication carrier, as shown on an itemized bill and as previously agreed upon by the Board and the carrier and the 3% accounting and collection charge described in Section Seven.

Section Nine

Simultaneously with the remittance described in Section Eight above each telecommunication carrier shall make a return to the Cook County Treasurer for the period to which the remittance applies stating as follows:

1. The name of the telecommunication carrier.
2. The telecommunication carrier's principal place of business.
3. The number of network connections to which the surcharge applies.
4. The amount of surcharge due.
5. Such other reasonable and related information such as the corporate authorities may require.

Section Ten

If it shall appear that an amount of surcharge has been paid which was not due under the provisions of this ordinance, whether as the result of a mistake of fact or an error of law, then such amount shall be credited against any surcharge due, or to become due, under this ordinance from the telecommunication carrier who made the erroneous payments; provided that no amounts erroneously paid more than three(3) years prior to the filing of a claim therefore shall be so credited. Ninety days prior notice shall be given to the Emergency Telephone System Board on any credit against a surcharge due.

Section Eleven

No action to recover any amount of surcharge due under the provisions of this ordinance shall be commenced more than three (3) years after the due date of such amount.

Section Twelve

Upon approval of the referendum, the Emergency Telephone Board System of Cook County shall be established. The Board shall consist of not fewer than five members, appointed by the President of the Cook County Board of Commissioners and approved by the Board of Commissioners.

At least three members of the Board shall be representative of the 9-1-1 public safety agencies, including but not limited to police departments, fire departments, emergency medical services providers, and emergency services and disaster agencies, and appointed on the basis of their ability or experience. Elected officials are also eligible to serve on the board. Members of the board shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses. Any 2 or more municipalities, counties, or combination thereof, that impose a surcharge may, instead of establishing individual boards, establish by intergovernmental agreement a Joint Emergency Telephone System Board pursuant to this Section. The manner of appointment of such a joint board shall be prescribed in the agreement.

The Board's powers and duties shall include, but are not limited to the following:

1. Planning a 9-1-1 system.
2. Coordinating and supervising the implementation, upgrading or maintenance of the system, including the establishment of equipment specifications and coding systems.
3. Receiving monies from the surcharge imposed under this Ordinance, and from any other source, for deposit into the Emergency Telephone System Fund.
4. Authorizing all disbursements from the fund.
5. Hiring, on a temporary basis, any staff necessary for the implementation or upgrade of the system.

All monies received by a board pursuant to a surcharge imposed under this Ordinance shall be deposited into a separate interest bearing Emergency Telephone System Fund account. The Cook County Treasurer shall be custodian of the fund. All interest accruing on the fund shall remain in the fund. No expenditures may be made from such fund except upon the direction of the board by resolution passed by a majority of all members of the board. Expenditures may be made only to pay for the costs associated with the following:

1. The design of the Emergency Telephone System.
2. The coding of an initial Master Street Address Guide database, and update and maintenance thereof.
3. The repayment of any monies advanced for the implementation of the system.
4. The charges for Automatic Number Identification and Automatic Location Identification equipment, and maintenance, replacement and update thereof.
5. The non-recurring charges related to installation of the Emergency Telephone System and the ongoing network charges.

6. Other products and services necessary for the implementation, upgrade and maintenance of the system and any other purpose related to the operation of the system, including costs attributable directly to the construction, leasing, or maintenance of any buildings or facilities or costs of personnel attributable directly to the operation of the system. Costs attributable directly to the operation of an emergency telephone system do not include the costs of public safety agency personnel who are and equipment that is dispatched in response to an emergency call.

The Board shall complete the database before implementation of the 9-1-1 system. The error ratio of the database shall not at any time exceed 1% of the total database.

Section Thirteen

Civil Liability

No public agency or public safety agency, nor any officer, agent or employee of any public agency or public safety agency, shall be liable for any civil damages as a result of any act or omission, except willful or wanton misconduct, in connection with developing, adopting, operating or implementing any plan or system required by this Ordinance.

No person who gives emergency instructions through a system established under this Ordinance to persons rendering services in an emergency at another location, nor any person following such instructions in rendering such services, shall be liable for any civil damages as a result of issuing or following the instructions, unless issuing or following the instructions constitutes willful or wanton misconduct.

This Section may not be offered as a defense in any judicial proceeding brought by the Attorney General to, compel compliance under Section 12 of the Emergency Telephone Systems Act.

Section Fourteen

The County shall not expend any County funds for the implementation, installation and maintenance or other related costs attributable to providing a 9-1-1 emergency system for the citizens of Cook County. However, the County may pay for the personnel necessary to operate the 9-1-1 system.


Section Fifteen

Any and all ordinances in conflict herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section Sixteen

As provided in Section One of this ordinance, and pursuant to the October 11, 2001 request by the Village of Dixmoor to be included in the Cook County 9-1-1 system, upon approval by the Illinois Commerce Commission all telecommunication carriers shall be notified to impose the County surcharge rate of \$1.25 per month per in service network connection, to all customers located within the Village of Dixmoor.

This Intergovernmental Agreement (“IGA”) is entered into by and between the County of Cook (“County”) on behalf of the Sheriff of Cook County (“Sheriff”) and the Village of Robbins (“Robbins”), (collectively, the “Parties”), pursuant to authority granted by the Illinois Constitution of 1970, Article VII, Section 10, and The Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 *et seq.*

I. RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Cook County Emergency Telephone Systems Board (“Cook ETSB”) operates the Cook County 9-1-1 system (“9-1-1 System”) in the unincorporated areas of Cook County and certain municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff processes 9-1-1 calls and provides other services for the 9-1-1 System, including call taking, dispatching, and radio monitoring; and

WHEREAS, the budget for the Sheriff’s Office, through the Annual Appropriation Bill adopted by the County Board, currently funds the salary and benefits for in excess of sixty employees who currently staff the 9-1-1 System’s communication center; and

WHEREAS, the Robbins Police have conducted their dispatch activity on the Robbins Emergency Telephone Systems Board, but are required to consolidate dispatch services with another emergency telephone systems board; and

WHEREAS, Robbins desires to obtain the Sheriff’s 9-1-1 System dispatching services for Robbins Police and agrees to reimburse the Sheriff for providing said services pursuant to this IGA; and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff agrees to provide 9-1-1 System dispatching/monitoring services to Robbins Police twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week; and

WHEREAS, the County, the Sheriff and Robbins seek to enter into this IGA where the Sheriff will provide dispatch services to the Robbins Police.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements set forth herein, the Parties agree as follows:

II. INCORPORATION OF RECITALS

The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein as though fully set forth.

III. GENERAL PROVISIONS

A. Term: The term of this IGA shall begin on November 1, 2022 (“Effective Date”) and shall continue for five (5) years from the Effective Date (“Termination Date”).

B. Termination: Either the County, upon the request of Sheriff, or Robbins, may terminate this IGA at any time after the first three (3) months of the Term upon one hundred eighty (180) days written notice.

C. Roles and Responsibilities:

- 1) The Sheriff agrees to provide 9-1-1 System dispatching services to Robbins twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. Robbins Police Department dispatch will be done on a Cook County 800 mhz frequency.
- 2) Robbins will adhere to current 9-1-1 Center procedures covering radio use and officer safety practices mandated by the Sheriff's Office.

D. Operational Reimbursement

- 1) Robbins agrees to reimburse the Sheriff's Office quarterly for all personnel and operational costs associated with this IGA, including but not limited to costs associated with any additional positions necessary for performance of services ("Sheriff's Reimbursement"). Reimbursements shall take place in accordance with the following schedule, with any partial year prorated based the number of days the IGA has been in effect for that year:

1st year of service - \$96,891.00
2nd year of service - \$101,872.00
3rd year of service - \$108,169.00
4th year of service - \$113,331.00
5th year of service - \$119,911.00

- 2) Sheriff will send Robbins an invoice quarterly. Payment to Sheriff will be due within ninety (90) days of receipt of invoice.

IV. INDEMNIFICATION

- A. Robbins agrees to indemnify, defend, save and hold the County and the Sheriff, and their respective Commissioners, agents, officers, and employees harmless from and against any and all liabilities, claims, demands or suits brought by any employee of Robbins pursuant to this IGA or member of the public arising out of any negligent act or omission of Robbins and/or its agents, officers, or employees in the performance of this IGA.
- B. The County shall be responsible for the acts of its agents, officers, or employees in the performance of this IGA.

V. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

In the event of a dispute between Robbins and the Sheriff concerning this IGA, each shall designate a representative who shall meet to resolve the dispute. If the designated representatives fail to resolve the dispute, then the Sheriff's General Counsel and Robbins's General Counsel are responsible for promptly resolving the dispute in good faith and in a cooperative manner.

VI. NOTICE

Unless otherwise specified, any notice, demand or request required hereunder shall be given in writing at the addresses set forth below, by any of the following means: (a) personal service during regular business hours; (b) facsimile transmission during regular business hours; (c) overnight courier; or (d) first class mail properly addressed with postage prepaid and deposited in the U. S.

Mail. Any notice, demand or request served personally or by facsimile transmission as aforesaid shall be effective upon receipt. Any notice, demand or request served by overnight courier shall be deemed received on the business day immediately following deposit with the overnight courier. Any notice, demand or request served by U.S. mail shall be deemed received two (2) business days following deposit in the mail. Notices shall be served at the following addresses or at such other place as the Parties may from time to time designate in writing by notice given hereunder

VII. MISCELLANEOUS

- A. Compliance with Laws. The Parties shall at all times observe and comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, statutes, ordinances, rules, regulations, codes and executive orders, now existing or hereinafter in effect, which may in any manner affect the performance of this IGA.
- B. Counterparts. This IGA may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which, taken together, shall constitute a single, integrated instrument.
- C. Governing Law and Venue. This IGA shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois, without regard to the principles of conflicts of law thereof. If there is a lawsuit under this IGA, each Party hereto agrees to the original jurisdiction of those courts located within the County of Cook, State of Illinois, with regard to any controversy arising out of, relating to, or in any way concerning the execution or performance of this IGA.
- D. Entire Agreement; Modification. This IGA constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes any prior agreements, negotiations and discussions. This IGA may not be modified or amended in any manner without the prior written consent of the Parties hereto. No term of this IGA may be waived or discharged orally or by any course of dealing, but only by an instrument in writing signed by the Party benefited by such term.
- E. Severability. If any term of this IGA or any application thereof is held invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this IGA shall be construed as if such invalid part were never included herein and this Agreement shall be and remain valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- F. Conflicts. This IGA shall not be legally binding if entered into in violation of the provisions of the Public Officer Prohibited Activities Act, 50 ILCS 105/0.01 *et seq.*

**RESOLUTION TO ACCEPT THE VILLAGE OF ROBBINS

WHEREAS, pursuant to 50 ILCS 15.4(a)(2), the Village of Robbins has requested that it be included in the Cook County 9-1-1 System and has agreed to the payment of the surcharge for such 9-1-1 services as established by the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the ETSB has agreed to accept the Village of Robbins into the Cook County 9-1-1 System subject to approval by the Illinois State Police.

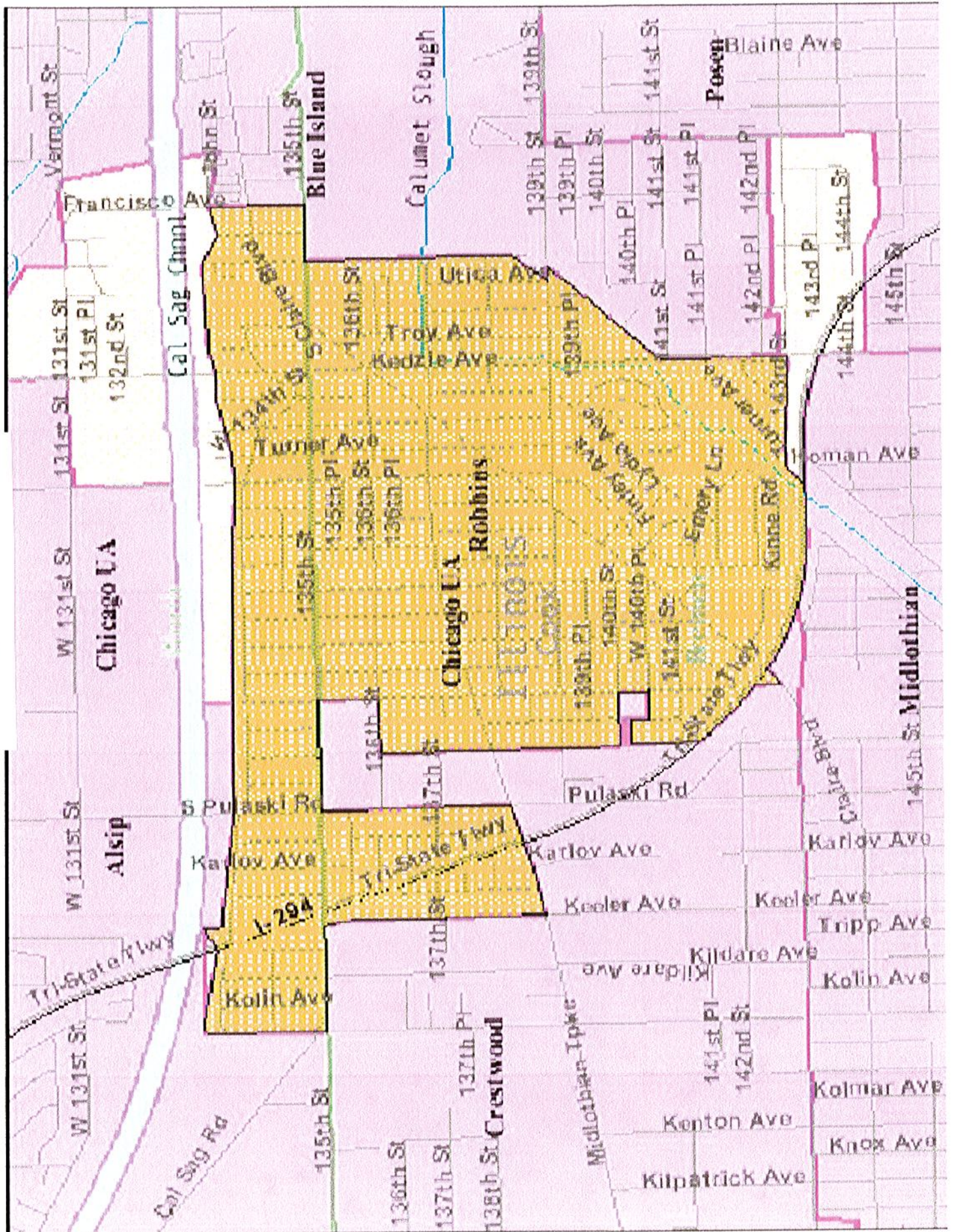

2). COUNTY, upon determining that their 911 Center must evacuate/relocate will contact the SOUTHWEST PSAP, advise reason for the alternate routing and provide estimated time of arrival of COUNTY personnel to their back-up center in Maywood, Illinois.

3). COUNTY will provide SOUTHWEST with one (1) contact Patrol Supervisor, rank of Sergeant or higher, assigned to South Area Patrol. COUNTY will provide SOUTHWEST with the call number and alternate phone/cell numbers for the responsible Patrol Supervisor.

4). SOUTHWEST agrees to contact this said Supervisor with any EMERGENCY calls needing dispatch, transmitting directly on a radio provided by the COUNTY ETSB and located at SOUTHWEST.

5). COUNTY Patrol Supervisor will be responsible for relaying back to SOUTHWEST the call number(s) of the appropriate COUNTY Beat Officer that will respond to the EMERGENCY call. SOUTHWEST then agrees to dispatch this officer(s) to the pending EMERGENCY call.

6). SOUTHWEST agrees to maintain radio communication, on the equipment provided by the COUNTY ETSB, with any officer responding to or involved in an EMERGENCY situation.

7). Once COUNTY personnel arrive at the 911 Back-up Center located at the Sheriff's Police Headquarters in Maywood, Illinois all communication (phone/radio) will be handled by COUNTY.

TEST PLAN DESCRIPTION

1) Description of test plan (back-up, overflow, failure, database).

The Cook County ETSB has enough capacity to add the Village of Robbins to its existing system without the need for any additional lines. The main Cook County Dispatch site is located at 9511 W Harrison in Des Plaines. In the event of a phone line failure, the 9-1-1 lines can either manually be switched over in Des Plaines by staff or switched by the 9-1-1 Resolution Center to Northwest Central Dispatch System and/or Southwest Central Dispatch by the selective router. The CCETSB has a backup center located in the Sheriff's Police Headquarters at 1401 S Maybrook Dr in Maywood. This location is tested on a monthly basis by 9-1-1 center staff and is coordinated with the 9-1-1 resolution center. Northwest Central Dispatch and Southwest Central Dispatch can handle overflow calls in the event a trunk is busy at the CCETSB. The current phone system, which is Zetron Call Max, is connected from Des Plaines to Maywood through an Opt-E-Man Circuit and has a backup of a point to point microwave connection. In the event that both paths were disturbed the Zetron controllers can function independently in both locations. The connection between Maywood and Des Plaines is not needed in order to have redundancy.
