Provide codes for all offenses within the incident determined to be hate-related and the number of victims for each such offense. In multiple offense incidents, report only those offenses determined to be hate-related.

- Record the two digit offense code indicated on the form and the total number of victims.
- Indicate up to six offenses for each incident.
- Indicate only one location for each incident.
- Indicate only one bias motivation per incident.
- Indicate each victim type corresponding to each offense identified within the hate-related incident.
- Where the victim type is an 'individual,' indicate the total number of individual victims involved in the incident irrespective of the number of offenses in which they were involved.
- Indicate the total number of offenders involved in the incident, if unknown, report that such is unknown.
- Provide the suspected offender's race, if known. If there was more than one offender, provide the race of the group as a whole.
