## ILLINOIS STATE POLICE DIRECTIVE OPS-075, CRASHES OR INCIDENTS INVOLVING DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE CLASSIFIED MATERIALS

## I. POLICY

The Illinois State Police (ISP) will respond to all crashes or incidents involving Department of Defense (DoD) classified materials and the DoD will provide ISP officers with the information they need to identify these shipments.

## II. PROCEDURES

- II.A. Officers investigating or handling a crash or incident will:
  - II.A.1. Examine the Government Bill of Lading (GBL) or the Commercial Bill of Lading (CBL) to determine if classified materials or sensitive items are being shipped.
    - II.A.1.a. The driver will have a copy of these documents in the vehicle.
    - II.A.1.b. Drivers transporting classified material will possess carrier furnished identification.
  - II.A.2. Inspect the Special Instructions for Motor Vehicle Drivers, DoD Form 836.
    - II.A.2.a. Military regulations require the use of this form for issuing instructions to drivers of all commercial and military vehicles transporting explosives or other hazardous materials over public roads nationwide.
    - II.A.2.b. This form lists:

II.A.2.b.1)	The commodity or cargo
II.A.2.b.2)	Required placards
II.A.2.b.3)	Actions to be taken in case of fire, crash, or breakdowns
II.A.2.b.4)	General and specific instructions and precautions
II.A.2.b.5)	Telephone numbers of offices to notify in the event of problems

II.A.3. If the shipment contains arms, ammunition, or explosives as identified on the GBL or CBL, the consignor (shipper or "from" agency) and consignee (receiver or "to" agency) must be notified.

**NOTE:** If neither can be reached, the driver or his/her company should telephone the Military Surface Deployment Distribution Command (SDDC) using the telephone numbers that are required to be on the DoD Form 836 and on the GBL or CBL, or by contacting the SDDC hotline at (800) 826-0794.

- II.B. All required U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) markings, labels, or placards are displayed on shipments containing ammunition or explosives. For additional information on placards, see the U.S. DOT, "Emergency Response Guide Book."
- II.C. Contact the SDDC at (757) 878-7511, if any concerns or questions arise involving a DoD shipment of classified material, arms, ammunition, or explosives.
