

Illinois State Police Office of Firearms Safety FOID Appeal Requirements/Checklist

Firearms Prohibitor – Certain Felonies (Court Action Required) Pursuant to: 430 LCS 65/10(a)

Instructions: If your Firearm Owner's Identification (FOID) Card was revoked or your FOID application was denied because you were convicted of a forcible felony, stalking, aggravated stalking, domestic battery, a violation of the Illinois Control led Substances Act that is classified as a Class 2 or greater felony, a violation of the Methamphetamine Control and Community Protection Act that is classified as a Class 2 or greater felony, or a violation of the Cannabis Control Act that is classified as a Class 2 or greater felony, or a violation of the Cannabis Control Act that is classified as a Class 2 or greater felony, or a violation of the Cannabis Control Act that is classified as a Class 2 or greater felony, or a violation of the Cannabis Control Act that is classified as a Class 2 or greater felony, or a violation of the Cannabis Control Act that is classified as a Class 2 or greater felony, or a violation of the Cannabis Control Act that is classified as a Class 2 or greater felony, a felony violation of Article 24 of the Criminal Code of 1961 or the Criminal Code of 2012, or an adjudication as a delinquent minor for the commission of an offense that if committed by an adult would be a felony, you are not permitted to obtain a Firearm Owner's Identification Card unless you receive relief from the courts. You are NOT required to appeal at this time; however, when you do so, the information listed below must be provided:

□ 1. If your FOID card was revoked, the first step in seeking relief is to surrender your FOID Card and a completed Firearm Disposition Record, documenting the transfer of all firearms in your possession. This should have been completed within 48 hours of the revocation consistent with 430 ILCS 65/9.5. If you have not completed this step, you may find a copy of the required form on the Office of Firearms Safety Website at the Forms and Checklists tab.

If your FOID card was denied, you may skip this step.

Once you have completed step one, you are required to file your appeal with the circuit court in writing in the county of your residence for a hearing upon such denial, revocation, or seizure. Please refer to 430 ILCS 65/10(a) for additional information.

For additional information regarding filing such an appeal, please contact the clerk's office for the county of your residence.

<u>Please Note:</u> If the circuit court grants your appeal, please provide a certified copy of the court record or court order so that your FOID can be reinstated. No action will be taken without a certified copy from the court.
