The Advisory Policy Board's purpose and objectives are to make general policy recommendations to the Illinois State Police (ISP) Director regarding the operational principles for LEADS; review and consider any change to the LEADS rules, regulations, standards and procedures; provide recommendations to the Director with respect to any participating agency that is not compliant with LEADS rules, including potential sanctions; review and consider any other LEADS issues as directed by the ISP Director.

LEADS APB BY-LAWS

LEADS ADMINISTRATOR REPORT

- 1. CJIS Updates, FBI CJIS Security Policy (CJISSECPOL) Modernization:
 - Security training is now required every year instead of every other year.
 - If you have questions about the modernized security policy , we suggest the following options:
 - the FBI has a website devoted to the security policy and a companion document with all the details of the control families.
 - you can visit the IJIS Institute at IJIS.ORG, a consortium of industry professionals, security professionals, government employees, FBI Security Officer, and other interested parties.
 - If licensing software, your IT partner should be aware of CJIS Security Policy.
 - You can call us directly or through our Help Desk. To clarify, our role is to help you assess if your security plan is compliant.
 - From October 1, 2025 to October 1, 2026, the FBI CJIS Division Audit Unit has suspended their audits of the states. ISP is not suspending IT audits and will continue to assess the P1 controls.

2. NCIC N3G (XML):

• The next generation has been in the works since 2017. Currently we are working on a new network connection to the FBI during Phase 1. Phase 2 will include a transition of the data. Agencies will not have to make any changes. The next generation will improve searches and algorithms, plus allow for compound names and offline searches.

LEADS COORDINATOR REPORT

- 1. Migration to Fox Talk / OFML:
 - In April 2022, we started the migration to FoxTalk with a total of 1,059 agencies migrating, so far. A large advantage for agencies is the migration allows for accessing driver's license imaging from the Illinois Secretary of State.
- 2. Firearm Restraining Order (FRO) to NCIC Extreme Risk Protection Order:
 - Since 2019, Illinois courts have issued orders called Firearm Restraining Order (FRO) that
 prohibits a subject from purchasing or possessing a firearm. The FROs that qualify will
 be sent to NCIC for addition to their Extreme Risk Protection Order file which can be
 accessed nationwide.
- 3. Field Notification Program (FNP) Modification
 - A system modification is necessary so that individuals entered into the LEADS FNP File can also be entered into the NCIC Violent Person File.
 - Record retention the entries purge from the Field Notification Program after 5 years, rather than every 24 months as discussed during the meeting.
- 4. Violent Person File (VPF)
 - ISP, along with the FBI, are encouraging local agencies to make entries into the Violent Person File. LEADS Hot File System (HFS) modifications are being made to allow FNP and VPF entries of the same person. There are three criteria to be included in the Violent Person File:
 - o convicted of assault or murder of a law enforcement officer;
 - o convicted of murder or attempted murder; or
 - o convicted of any violent offense where a firearm or weapon is used.
